**ORDER OF SUSPENSION**

**WILLIAM NICHOLAS BURDIE,  
Respondent.**

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Labor Code section 139.21(a)(1)(A) requires the Administrative Director of the Division of Workers' Compensation to suspend any physician, practitioner, or provider from participating in the workers' compensation system as a physician, practitioner, or provider if the individual or entity has been convicted of any felony or misdemeanor and that crime either: (1) involves fraud or abuse of the federal Medicare or Medicaid programs, the Medi-Cal program, or the workers' compensation system, or fraud or abuse of any patient; (2) relates to the conduct of the individual's medical practice as it pertains to patient care; or (3) is a financial crime that relates to the federal Medicare or Medicaid programs, the Medi-Cal program, or the workers' compensation system.

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Labor Code section 139.21(a)(1)(B) requires the Administrative Director of the Division of Workers' Compensation to suspend any physician, practitioner, or provider from participating in the workers' compensation system as a physician, practitioner, or provider if the individual or entity has been suspended, due to fraud or abuse, from the federal Medicare or Medicaid programs or the Medi-Cal program.

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Labor Code section 139.21(a)(1)(C) requires the Administrative Director to suspend any physician, practitioner, or provider from participating in the workers' compensation system as a physician, practitioner, or provider whose license, certification or approval to provide health care services has been surrendered or revoked.

1 On or about February 21, 2014, Respondent William Nicholas Burdie's (Burdie)  
2 was convicted in the United States District Court, Southern District of California, of a  
3 crime described in Labor Code section 139.21(a)(1)(A). (USA v. Alvarado Medical Plaza  
4 Pharmacy, Inc. et al., Case No. 13CR4295-JLS).

5 On or about October 29, 2014, Respondent Burdie was suspended, due to fraud  
6 or abuse, from the federal Medicare or Medicaid programs.

7 On or about February 22, 2017, Respondent Burdie's license, certification or  
8 approval to provide health care services was surrendered or revoked by the California  
9 Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs.

10 On or about April 21, 2022, the Administrative Director mailed to Respondent  
11 Burdie a written notice of the right to a hearing regarding the suspension and the  
12 procedure to follow to request a hearing, as provided in Labor Code section  
13 139.21(b)(2) and California Code of Regulations, title 8, section 9788.1.

14 Pursuant to Labor Code section 139.21(b)(2) and California Code of Regulations,  
15 title 8, section 9788.1(d), the written notice advised Respondent Burdie that the  
16 suspension would start thirty (30) calendar days after the date of mailing of written  
17 notice, unless Respondent Burdie submitted a written request for a hearing within ten  
18 (10) calendar days of the date of mailing of the notice.

19 Respondent Burdie did not submit a written request for hearing within ten (10)  
20 calendar days of the date of mailing of the notice.

21 The Administrative Director is required to suspend any physician, practitioner, or  
22 provider pursuant to Labor Code section 139.21 and Title 8, California Code of  
23 Regulations section 9788.2, after thirty (30) days from the date the notice was mailed,  
24 unless the physician, practitioner, or provider submits a written request for a hearing  
25 within ten (10) calendar days of the date of mailing of the notice;

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1           **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that Respondent William Nicholas Burdie is hereby  
2 suspended from participating in the workers' compensation system as a physician,  
3 practitioner, or provider.
