PREDETERMINED INCREASE FOR
CARPENTER AND RELATED TRADES
(SC-23-31-2-2006-2)

IN ALL LOCALITIES WITHIN IMPERIAL, INYO, KERN, LOS ANGELES,
MONO, ORANGE, RIVERSIDE, SAN BERNARDINO,
SAN LUIS OBISPO, SANTA BARBARA, AND VENTURA COUNTIES

This predetermined increase for the above named craft applies only to the current determination for work being performed on public works projects with bid advertisement dates on or after **September 1, 2006**, until this determination is superseded by a new determination or a predetermined increase modification notice becomes effective.

When referencing our prevailing wage determinations, please note that if the prevailing wage rate determination which was in effect on the bid advertisement date of a project has a single asterisk (*) after the expiration date, the rate will be good for the life of the project. However, if a prevailing wage rate determination has double asterisks (**) after the expiration date, the rate must be updated on the following date to reflect the predetermined rate change(s).

CARPENTER: All classifications (except Roof Loader of Shingles, Scaffold Builder, Head Rockslinger, and Rock Bargeman or Scowman):

Determination SC-23-31-2-2006-2 is currently in effect and expires on December 31st, 2006**.

Effective on January 1, 2007, the \$0.25 increase is allocated to Pension.

Effective on July 1, 2007, the \$2.25 increase is allocated as follows: \$1.90 to the Basic Hourly Rate, \$0.25 to Pension, & \$0.10 to Vacation/Holiday.

Effective on July 1, 2008, the \$2.25 increase is allocated as follows: \$1.84 to the Basic Hourly Rate, \$0.30 to Pension, \$0.09 to Vacation/Holiday, and \$0.02 to Training.

Effective on July 1, 2009, there will be an increase of \$1.00 to be allocated to Pension. (See modification notice dated June 29, 2009)

Effective on July 1, 2010, there will be an increase of \$0.50 to be allocated to Pension. (See Important Notice dated June 24, 2010)

Effective July 1, 2011, there will be an increase of \$0.75 to be allocated to Health and Welfare. (See Important Notice dated June 24, 2010)

ROOF LOADER OF SHINGLES

Effective on July 1, 2007, there is an increase of \$1.33 to the Basic Hourly Rate, \$0.25 to Pension, and \$0.10 to Vacation/Holiday. (See Important Notice dated July 3, 2007)

Effective on July 1, 2008, there is an increase of \$1.29 to the Basic Hourly Rate, \$0.30 to Pension, \$0.09 to Vacation/Holiday, and \$0.02 to Training. (See Important Notice dated August 6, 2008)

Effective on July 1, 2009, there will be an increase of \$1.00 to be allocated to Pension. (See modification notice dated June 29, 2009)

Effective on July 1, 2010, there will be an increase of \$0.50 to be allocated to Pension. (See Important Notice dated June 24, 2010)

Effective July 1, 2011, there will be an increase of \$0.75 to be allocated to Health and Welfare. (See Important Notice dated June 24, 2010)

SCAFFOLD BUILDER *(See Important Notices dated July 3 and 23, 2007)*

Effective on July 1, 2007, there is an increase of \$1.15 to the Basic Hourly Rate, \$0.25 to Pension, and \$0.10 to Vacation/Holiday.

Effective on July 1, 2008, there is an increase of \$1.09 to the Basic Hourly Rate, \$0.30 to Pension, \$0.09 to Vacation/Holiday, and \$0.02 to Training.

Effective on July 1, 2009, there will be an increase of \$1.00 to be allocated to Pension. (See modification notice dated June 29, 2009)

Effective on July 1, 2010, there will be an increase of \$0.50 to be allocated to Pension. (See modification notice dated June 29, 2009)

HEAD ROCKSLINGER & ROCK BARGEMAN OR SCOWMAN

Effective on July 1, 2007, there is an increase of \$1.80 to the Basic Hourly Rate, \$0.25 to Pension, and \$0.10 to Vacation/Holiday. (See Important Notice dated July 3, 2007)

Effective on July 1, 2008, there is an increase of \$1.84 to the Basic Hourly Rate, \$0.30 to Pension, \$0.09 to Vacation/Holiday, and \$0.02 to Training.

Effective on July 1, 2009, there will be an increase of \$1.00 to be allocated to Pension. (See modification notice dated June 29, 2009)

Effective on July 1, 2010, there will be an increase of \$0.50 to be allocated to Pension. (See Important Notice dated June 24, 2010)

Effective July 1, 2011, there will be an increase of \$0.75 to be allocated to Health and Welfare. (See Important Notice dated June 24, 2010)
