WORKER OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH SPECIALIST TRAINING

This free three-day course is being offered to NISH-affiliated Community Rehabilitation Programs that serve and employ individuals with disabilities. The training prepares supervisors and job coaches to be Worker Occupational Safety and Health (WOSH) Specialists so they can learn to take a leadership role in promoting health and safety at their own workplace. The training is “hands on,” interactive, and fun. The course is presented by UC Berkeley’s Labor Occupational Health Program (LOHP) in partnership with NISH - Creating Employment Opportunities for People with Severe Disabilities.
