I. Call to Order/Roll

Chairperson Aram Hodess called the meeting to order at 2:44 p.m.

DAS Deputy Chief Glen Forman called the roll.

II. Review/approval July 27, 2016 Minutes.

A motion and a second were made to approve the July 27, 2016 minutes. All were in favor. The motion carried.

III. Old Business

Proposed changes to regulations governing public works apprenticeship
Enforcement

There was a discussion of proposed changes from DIR to CAC regulations governing public works apprenticeship enforcement. Several modifications to these proposed changes were suggested.

First, DIR has proposed deleting subdivision (g) of CAC Regulation 228 because 228 (g) it does not include “apprentice” or “a licensee who is a sole proprietor”. Rather than delete 228 (g), it was suggested that 228(g) be revised to include “apprentice” and “a licensee who is a sole proprietor”.

It was also suggested that the last, identical sentences in both CAC regulation 230 and in 230.1 which address a contractor's burden to prove timely request for dispatch of an apprentice are redundant and should be deleted.

Finally, it was noted that the reference to 1771.2(a)(4) appears to be a typo and should instead be 1771.2(a)(4).

Discussion on this item is continued to the next CAC meeting.

IV. New Business

Proposed changes to regulations governing online instructions.

4. A proposal from the RSI Committee to add a new paragraph (i) amending CAC Regulation 212(a)(7) was discussed. It was moved and seconded that an amended RSI Committee proposal be adopted; clarifying that online learning approved in the training curriculum would conform to the rubric used for the California Community Colleges Online Education Initiative. Numerous concerns were raised from Commissioners and the floor including whether the new language was appropriately located in Section 212. Because of this and other concerns, the motion was withdrawn. Lucy Wang was requested to assist in the drafting of any new language if necessary. This issue will be taken up at the next CAC meeting of the RSI and Rules and Regulation Committees.

V. Adjournment: It was m/s/c to adjourn. The meeting adjourned at 4:15 p.m.
