MR. CORTES: Okay. Good morning everyone. It's about -- it's 10 o'clock. My name is John Cortes. I'm an Industrial Relations Counsel for the Division of Workers' Compensation. So before we begin today's conference call public hearing, I want to inform everyone on this call that this call is being recorded. I also want to ask if anyone wishes to make a public comment today, that if you do, can you please give us your full name, your first name and your last name, the organization you are affiliated with, if any, and contact information in case we need to provide you with any updates. MR. CORTES: Okay. Diane, just one second. Okay. We're just going to get a list of all the -- all the speakers today.

MS. PRZEPIORSKI: Okay. Great.

MR. CORTES: Okay. So other than Diane, is there anyone else who wishes to make a comment this morning?

Again, I'll just give this a second just in case people are just joining us now.

What we are doing is we're taking down a list -writing down the names of all the people who wish to make a
comment this morning. So if anyone wishes to make a
comment, go ahead and please speak up and provide us with
your name and the organization you're affiliated with.

Is there anyone else? Okay. For now I'm just going to -- was that someone who wanted to put down their name?

Okay. So if you are undecided at this time or change your mind during the hearing and you wish to speak, I will give you an opportunity to make a public comment after everyone on this list and so far it's only been Diane has spoken.

Okay. So before we begin, I want to ask everyone

to please press their respective mute buttons to minimize unintended background noises, and press unmute when you wish to speak, and please make sure to state your name before you begin speaking for our hearing reporter who's transcribing today's hearing.

Okay. So it is 10:04. Why don't we go ahead and get started.

Thank you for participating in today's conference call. Again, my name is John Cortes. I'm an Industrial Relations Counsel for the Division of Workers' Compensation. This is our noticed conference call public hearing for the evidence-based updates to the Medical Treatment Utilization Schedule also known as the M-T-U-S. The division is proposing to make evidence-based updates to the M-T-U-S by adopting the latest published version of the American College of Occupational and Environmental Medicine or ACOEM's Knee Disorders Guideline, Occupational/Work-Related Asthma Guideline, Occupational interstitial Lung Disease Guideline, and the Depressive — and the Depressive

Now, I would like to take a moment to introduce the other DWC staff on this conference call today. As I've mentioned, I'm joined by Maureen Gray, the Division's Regulations Coordinator. Also on the call is George Parisotto, the DWC's Administrator Director. In addition,

we have Yvonne Hauscarriague, the DWC Legal Unit's Chief Counsel, and finally joining us is Dr. Raymond Meister, the DWC's Executive Medical Director. Our hearing reporter is Angelica Cazarez.

So the purpose of this hearing today is to receive comments on the proposed amendments to the regulations, and we welcome any comments you have about them. Please note we will not question, respond to, or discuss anyone's comments, although we may ask for clarification or ask you to elaborate further on any points that you are presenting. All of your comments both given verbally here today and those submitted in writing will be considered in determining what revisions, if any, we make to the proposed regulations.

Please restrict the subject of your comments to the proposed regulations. We usually ask that you limit your comments to three minutes in length. However, since only one person so far has signed up to speak, we will allow you to speak without the normal time limit.

I will call the names of those who have indicated they wish to testify today, and I apologize in advance if I mispronounce anyone's name. All testimony today will be taken down by the hearing reporter.

When everyone on this list has had a chance to testify, I will check to see if anybody new has joined our call who wants to testify or if anybody else has additional

comments. This hearing will continue as long as there are people on this call who wish to comment on the proposed regulations, but it will close at 5:00 o'clock this afternoon.

I doubt it's going to last that long since we only have one person so far who wishes to speak. If the hearing continues into the lunch hour, again, we will take at least an hour break.

Okay. So, with that, let me go ahead and ask Diane

to go ahead and speak and provide your comments.

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DIANE PRZEPIORSKI

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Thank you, John. Good morning everyone. My name is Diane Przepiorski, and I'm with the California Orthopaedic Association, as you know, orthopedic surgeons statewide. I appreciate the opportunity to make comments on -- and the fact that the division is moving forward with adopting updates to the ACOEM treatment guidelines. We support the adoption of the updated guidelines, and really, in this time of a lot of change, we're aware that ACOEM is updating their guidelines more regularly, and we would just urge the division to adopt those changes as soon as they are available.

And -- and we know that some of the changes will be reflective of the changes under the COVID-19, so that's why we believe it's terribly important for the division to sort of keep up with the ACOEM changes as they become available. So really that's my comment for today.

And as I said, we really appreciate the division moving forward with the formal process to adopt the changes. Thank you.

MR. CORTES: Thank you, Diane. I also want to remind everyone on this call, although the DWC has not yet formerly adopted the ACOEM COVID-19 guidelines, those guidelines are being amended and updated regularly. I mean, since April I

think -- I think they've been changed or updated about three or four times now. So we're waiting for the evidence-base to settle down with regards to COVID-19. And then once that -- once the evidence-base settles down a little bit, then we will go ahead and adopt the ACOEM COVID-19 guideline. Okay. Is there anyone else who wishes to speak who did not provide their names initially? I'll give this a

second. Go ahead and let us know now.

Again, I'm just giving this a second for anyone who joined the call a little bit later, a little after 10:00 o'clock who wishes to speak other than Diane.

Okay. Well, if we do not have anyone else who wishes to make a verbal comment today, I want to remind everyone that the DWC is accepting written comments up until midnight tonight.
