HOW THE IMR FINAL DETERMINATION WAS MADE

MAXIMUS Federal Services sent the complete case file to an expert reviewer. He/she has no affiliation with the employer, employee, providers or the claims administrator. The expert reviewer is Board Certified in Emergency Medicine and is licensed to practice in New York. He/she has been in active clinical practice for more than five years and is currently working at least 24 hours a week in active practice. The expert reviewer was selected based on his/her clinical experience, education, background, and expertise in the same or similar specialties that evaluate and/or treat the medical condition and disputed items/services. He/she is familiar with governing laws and regulations, including the strength of evidence hierarchy that applies to Independent Medical Review determinations.

CLINICAL CASE SUMMARY

The expert reviewer developed the following clinical case summary based on a review of the case file, including all medical records:

The patient is a 52-year-old female who was injured on June 30, 2011. The patient continued to experience pain in her shoulder and knee. Physical examination was notable for tenderness to the right knee, full range of motion of the right knee with crepitus and pain, and tenderness of the right acromioclavicular joint. Diagnoses included status post right knee surgery, neck pain with prior history of cervical fusion, and left shoulder pain. Treatment included medications and surgery. Request for authorization for urine drug screen was submitted for consideration.

IMR ISSUES, DECISIONS AND RATIONALES

The Final Determination was based on decisions for the disputed items/services set forth below:

Urine Drug Screen: Upheld

Claims Administrator guideline: Decision based on MTUS Chronic Pain Treatment Guidelines Page(s): 43.

MAXIMUS guideline: Decision based on MTUS Chronic Pain Treatment Guidelines Pain Interventions and Guidelines Page(s): 78. Decision based on Non-MTUS Citation Official Disability Guidelines (ODG) Pain, urine drug testing

Decision rationale: Chronic Pain Medical Treatment Guidelines state that urinary drug testing should be used if there are issues of abuse, addiction, or pain control in patients being treated with opioids. ODG criteria for Urinary Drug testing are recommended for patients with chronic

opioid use. Patients at low risk for addiction/aberrant behavior should be tested within 6 months of initiation of therapy and yearly thereafter. Those patients with moderate risk for addiction/aberrant behavior should undergo testing 2-3 times/year. Patients with high risk of addiction/aberrant behavior should be tested as often as once per month. In this case the patient has not shown any aberrant/addictive behavior. Annual urine drug testing is indicated. There is no documentation regarding the date or results of previous urine drug screens. Medical necessity for urine drug testing cannot be determined. The request is not medically necessary.
