HOW THE IMR FINAL DETERMINATION WAS MADE

MAXIMUS Federal Services sent the complete case file to an expert reviewer. He/she has no affiliation with the employer, employee, providers or the claims administrator. The expert reviewer is Board Certified in Orthopedic Surgery and is licensed to practice in New York. He/she has been in active clinical practice for more than five years and is currently working at least 24 hours a week in active practice. The expert reviewer was selected based on his/her clinical experience, education, background, and expertise in the same or similar specialties that evaluate and/or treat the medical condition and disputed items/services. He/she is familiar with governing laws and regulations, including the strength of evidence hierarchy that applies to Independent Medical Review determinations.

CLINICAL CASE SUMMARY

The expert reviewer developed the following clinical case summary based on a review of the case file, including all medical records:

The patient has a date of injury November 4, 2009. The patient has chronic back pain. He reports pain radiating down to the bilateral legs. On physical examination he has decreased sensation and L4 and L5. There is no L4 or S1 reflex. An X-ray showed degeneration of the disc at L5-S1. A lumbar MRI shows disc bulge at L3-4 and facet changes at L4-5. There is no abnormal finding at L5-S1 on MRI. The patient continues to have chronic low back pain. At issue is whether two-level lumbar fusion is medically necessary.

IMR ISSUES, DECISIONS AND RATIONALES

The Final Determination was based on decisions for the disputed items/services set forth below:

Anterior Posterior Lumbar Interbody Fusion Graft at L4-L5 and L5- S1: Upheld

Claims Administrator guideline: Decision based on MTUS ACOEM Chapter 12 Low Back Complaints Page(s): 307.

MAXIMUS guideline: Decision based on MTUS ACOEM Chapter 12 Low Back Complaints Page(s): 307-322.

Decision rationale: This patient does not meet criteria for two-level lumbar fusion surgery. Specifically, there is no evidence of instability fracture or tumor. Also there is no evidence of significant neurologic deficit. The patient has no red flag indicators for spinal fusion surgery

such as fracture, tumor, or instability. The established criteria for a two-level lumbar fusion surgery have not met. As such, the request is not medically necessary and appropriate.

2 assistant surgeons one for posterior and one for anterior: Upheld
