HOW THE IMR FINAL DETERMINATION WAS MADE

He/she has been in active clinical practice for more than five years and is currently working at least 24 hours a week in active practice. The expert reviewer was selected based on his/her clinical experience, education, background, and expertise in the same or similar specialties that evaluate and/or treat the medical condition and disputed items/Service. He/she is familiar with governing laws and regulations, including the strength of evidence hierarchy that applies to Independent Medical Review determinations.

CLINICAL CASE SUMMARY

The expert reviewer developed the following clinical case summary based on a review of the case file, including all medical records:

The injured worker is a 70 year old female, who sustained an industrial injury on 7/16/99. The injured worker was diagnosed as having left knee degenerative joint disease. Treatment to date has included a total right knee replacement on 3/10/11, left knee injections, physical therapy, and medication. Radiographs 3/27/15 demonstrates mild tricompartmental osteophytes with moderate narrowing of the medial and patellofemoral compartments. Currently, 5/5/15 the injured worker complains of left knee pain. The treating physician requested authorization for an inpatient left total knee replacement, pre-operative electrocardiogram, a 2-3 day inpatient stay, an assistant surgeon, pre-operative surgeon, pre-operative clearance, pre-operative labs (CBC, PT, PTT, and renal function panel), the purchase of a walker, the purchase of a shower chair, a home health nurse 1-2 times weekly for 4 weeks, and home physical therapy 1-2 times weekly for 4 weeks.

IMR ISSUES, DECISIONS AND RATIONALES

The Final Determination was based on decisions for the disputed items/services set forth below:

Left total knee replacement - inpatient: Upheld

Claims Administrator guideline: The Claims Administrator did not base their decision on the MTUS. Decision based on Non-MTUS Citation Official Disability Guidelines.

MAXIMUS guideline: The Expert Reviewer did not base their decision on the MTUS. Decision based on Non-MTUS Citation Official Disability Guidelines (ODG) Knee arthroplasty.

Decision rationale: CA MTUS/ACOEM is silent on the issue of total knee replacement. According to the Official Disability Guidelines regarding Knee arthroplasty: Criteria for knee joint replacement which includes conservative care with subjective findings including limited range of motion less than 90 degrees. In addition the patient should have a BMI of less than 35 and be older than 50 years of age. There must also be findings on standing radiographs of significant loss of chondral clear space. The clinical information submitted demonstrates insufficient evidence to support a knee arthroplasty in this patient. There is no documentation from the exam notes from 5/5/15 demonstrates no BMI. There is also mild tricompartmental osteophytes and moderate narrowing on radiographs from 3/27/15. There is no documentation of range of motion less than 90 degrees. Therefore the guideline criteria have not been met and the determination is not medically necessary.

Associated surgical service: inpatient, 2-3 days: Upheld

Decision rationale: Since the primary procedure is not medically necessary, none of the associated services are medically necessary.
