Dear Mr. Efstathiou and Mr. MacGregor:

In accordance with the provisions of Title 8, California Code Regulations, section 16425, initial approval of the County of Los Angeles, Department of Public Works, Division of Architectural Engineering, Labor Compliance Program (LCP) is hereby granted, effective as of the date of this letter. As currently provided in section 16425(c) of the regulations, initial approval shall automatically expire one year from the date of this letter unless extended in writing by the Director. The regulations also authorize programs to apply for final approval after eleven months of continuous operation. Please note, however, that we are considering regulatory amendments that would change how approvals are designated and extend the minimum period of operation needed to seek a change in approval status.


Your annual reporting period shall run from March 1 of each year through the last day of February of the following year, with annual reports due within 60 days following the close of your reporting period. (8 Cal.Code Reg. sec. 16431.) Sample reporting forms, which may become mandatory under current regulatory proposals, are available on our web site.

Please note that the Director of Industrial Relations previously approved the LCP of Department of Public Works' Construction Division (ID No. 2005.00457) on February 7, 2005, and it continues to be an approved LCP. Under current law, it is not necessary to have separately approved LCPs based on types of projects or multiple statutory mandates. This is explained in the Frequently Asked Questions linked to our LCP web page at [http://www.dir.ca.gov/LCP/LCP\\_FAQs.html](http://www.dir.ca.gov/LCP/LCP_FAQs.html) and will also be clarified in our pending regulatory amendments. Should the Department of Public Works or the County of Los Angeles as a whole choose to operate a single consolidated LCP, you would simply need to notify us of that intent and then make sure that all activity is reported by that single entity.
