Did the Decision of the Administrative Law Judge properly affirm violations for failure to ensure that employees operated industrial trucks in a safe manner by maintaining a safe distance from other vehicles, and for failure to ensure that employees traveled with the load trailing when the load being carried obstructed forward view.

Whether the cited employer established procedures adequate to protect employees from COVID-19.

1371294 KPRS Construction Services, Inc.

Whether the employer violated section 1632 as alleged? Whether the ALJ's ruling that the Division did not meet its burden of proof regarding the employer's IIPP was correct.

1692964 L & S Framing, Inc.

Whether Employer committed the violations alleged in the citations, including alleged violations of section 1704, subdivision (f) [failure to adopt a compliant Code of Safe Practices]; section 1704,

subdivision (b)(2) [failure to ensure that nailers and staplers were operated in accordance with manufacturer's recommendations], and section 1704, subdivision (g), 1509, and section 3203 [inadequate safety training on the use of nailers and staplers].

Did the Decision of the Administrative Law Judge properly find that employees were exposed to the hazard of a failure to provide a swinging gate or equivalent protection at the entrance to a ladder opening on a platform.

Whether the ALJ property affirmed the citations and, if so, whether Employer committed a serious accident-related violation of section 3328, subdivision (a).
