ACTING CHAIR CRAWFORD: Good morning. This meeting of the Occupational and Health Standards Board is now called to order. I ask that all of you stand and join me in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

(Pledge of Allegiance)

ACTING CHAIR CRAWFORD: I am Kathleen Crawford, Acting Chair for today's meeting, and the other Board Members present in Redding are: Dave Harrison, Labor Representative; Chris Laszcz-Davis, Management Representative; Dave Thomas, Labor Representative.

The Board meeting -- the Board Member attending via teleconference is Derek Urwin, Occupational Safety Representative.

Derek, can you please let us know whom, if anyone, 18 years of age or older, is present with you and their relationship to you?

BOARD MEMBER URWIN: There is nobody present with me.

ACTING CHAIR CRAWFORD: Thank you. I need to remind you please keep your camera on and if it goes off, please let us know the reason for that.

22 When the public comment begins, we are going to 23 alternate between three in-person and three remote 24 commenters.

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For our participants who are native Spanish

1 speakers, we are working with Ruth Ibarra to provide 2 interpretation into English for the Board. 3 At this time, Ruth Ibarra will provide introductions to the Spanish-speaking commenters. 4 5 (Spanish introductions and comment instructions) 6 ACTING CHAIR CRAWFORD: Thank you, Ruth. 7 Welcome to Redding. For those of you online, 8 you're missing out. Redding is a beautiful place, so 9 thank you for those who attended in person. 10 Best regards to Joe Alioto, who is away, and we 11 will do our best to maintain without him. 12 So one more reminder: Mute your phones before 13 we go forward. 14 So we're going to move on. 15 Before we open the public hearing, Steve Smith will brief the Board on the rulemaking proposal. 16 The 17 Board Members will then have the opportunity to make 18 comments and ask questions. The Board hearing will be 19 open after the Board has finished its discussion. 20 Today's public hearing item scheduled is: 21 Title 8: Construction Safety Orders, Section 1514, 22 Proper Fit of Personal Protective Equipment, Horcher. 23 Steve, will you please brief the Board? 24 MR. SMITH: Chair Crawford, Board Members, the 25 proposal before you today is developed in response to a

federal final rule and is intended to ensure that personal protective equipment, or PPE, that is provided to construction employees is of proper design and proper fit so that it affords adequate protection for those employees when they are wearing them.

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A little background on the proposal is that in December the 12th, Federal OSHA printed in the Federal Register their final rule amending their construction safety order for personal protective equipment and on the -- January the 13th, that proposal went into effect at the federal level.

In response to that final rule, state plans such as California are obligated to adopt regulations that are at least as effective as the final rule within six months of promulgation.

So we proposed the -- the change to Section 1514 in response to that final rule and the public hearing was noticed in March 28th of this year, and of course, we are here today to receive any public comments on that proposal.

The proposed change to the standard applies to all personal protective equipment being used by construction employees. The reason for the change is that PPE must be properly fit to provide appropriate protection to employees from workplace hazards. Of course, improperly fitting PPE may fail to protect any -to provide any protection to an employee, reduce the effectiveness of the protection, and present additional hazards or discourage employees from using such equipment in the workplace.

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Subsection E of our section is revised to also require that PPE be "of safe design and construction" and new subsection F was added to essentially have verbatim language from the Federal OSHA standard that says that PPE shall be selected to ensure that it properly fits all affected employees.

12 In the rulemaking for this proposal, it goes under what we call our Horcher rulemaking requirements 13 14 that is exempt from the Administrative Procedure Act 15 requirements. So it's an accelerated rulemaking process 16 and the purpose of the rulemaking process is to -- to 17 make sure that we are at least as effective and that 18 there's nothing unique in California that we may want to 19 change.

So Section 142.3 of the Labor Code requires that all our Title 8 regulations be at least as effective as Federal standards. Subsection (a)(3) exempts the Board from the APA, as I was saying, when adopting these rules that are substantially the same as Federal standards and though -- although we're not required to hold a public hearing under this subsection, we do that, as the Board elects to do a public hearing and consider comments that are limited to two areas: First, identify any clear and compelling reasons for California to deviate from the Federal standard and, second, to identify any issues unique to California related to this proposal should -which should be addressed in this rulemaking and/or a subsequent rulemaking.

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To date, although at the time of this writing there were no written comments, we did receive one comment on Tuesday from Federal OSHA and their comment was that they consider our proposal at least as effective. So we are appreciative of Federal OSHA reviewing our proposal and considering it to be at least as effective.

So with that, the proposal is now ready for Board and public comment and if there's any questions, I'll be happy to ask them -- answer them.

ACTING CHAIR CRAWFORD: Thank you, Steve.

Does the Board have any questions or comments? BOARD MEMBER THOMAS: I'll just make a comment. I'm glad to see this, but I was just reminiscing a little bit about when I first started working construction. PPE was considered optional. You just wore it if you wanted to and, you know, over the years, that's changed tremendously for -- much for the better because people didn't use eyewear if they didn't really have to. They wouldn't wear a mask, earplugs, gloves, all those things that are just considered you have to have with you now. But I started back far enough where all that stuff was optional and a lot of people, including myself, would get hurt over stuff that they shouldn't have gotten hurt over. So I just wanted to make that comment.

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ACTING CHAIR CRAWFORD: Thank you. That's a great comment.

11 All right. We will now proceed with the public 12 hearing. During the hearing, we will consider the 13 proposed changes to occupational safety and health 14 standards that were noticed for review today. The 15 Standards Board adopts standards that in our judgment are enforceable, reasonable, understandable, and contribute 16 17 directly to the safety and health of California 18 employees. The Board is interested in your testimony on 19 the matters before us. Your recommendations are 20 appreciated and will be considered before a final 21 decision is made.

If you have written comments, you may read them into the record, but it is not necessary to do so. You may hand OSHSB staff your written comments or submit via email to oshsbrulemaking@dir.ca.gov by 5:00 p.m. today. Staff will ensure that they are included in the record and forward copies of your comments to each Board Member, and I assure you that your comments will be given every consideration. Please include your name and address on any written materials you submit.

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I would also like to remind the audience that the public hearing is a forum for receiving comments on the proposed regulations, not to hold public debate. While rebuttal comments may be appropriate to clarify a point, it is not appropriate to engage in arguments.

If you would like to comment orally today, please line up at the podium when I ask for public testimony. Please state your name and affiliation, if any, and identify what portion of the regulation you intend to address each time you speak.

If you are participating remotely and would like to comment, you may join the comment queue by clicking the public comment queue link in the "Board Meetings" section on the main page of the OSHSB website or by calling (510) 868-2730 to access the automated public comment queue voicemail.

For commenters attending via teleconference or videoconference, please listen for your name and invitation to speak. When it is your turn to address the Board, unmute yourself and if you're using WebEx or -- and if you're using WebEx or dial star 6 on your phone to unmute yourself if you're using the teleconference line.

At this time, Ruth will provide instructions to the Spanish-speaking commenters so they are aware of the public hearing comment process for today's public hearing.

At this time, we will accept public testimony. If there are in-person participants who would like to comment, you may begin lining up at the speaker's podium at this time. When it is your turn to speak, please provide a completed request-to-speak slip to the attendant near the podium and announce yourself to the Board prior to delivering a comment.

1 So given the amount of overwhelming MR. JOHNSON: 2 demand for time, I'd better get going. 3 My name is Steve Johnson and I am with Association of Roofing Contractors of the Bay Area 4 5 Counties and good morning, members of the Board, Board staff, and members of the Division. 6 7 I wanted to direct my comments today on the 8 upcoming heat elements prevention for indoor and outdoor 9 heat, just talk a little bit about the proposed language. 10 So the current version with the 11 acclimatization --12 ACTING CHAIR CRAWFORD: Excuse me just for a moment. I don't think we're taking comments on heat today. 13 14 MR. JOHNSON: Oh. Is this for --15 ACTING CHAIR CRAWFORD: Not right now. 16 MR. JOHNSON: -- PPE? 17 ACTING CHAIR CRAWFORD: This is PPE only. 18 Okay. I'll make a brief comment on MR. JOHNSON: 19 PPE. Just that one of the challenges that I hope the 20 Division keeps in mind is that sometimes with women in 21 construction, it's difficult to find the right size and 22 the right fit and is something that employers struggle 23 I know women struggle with it who work in with. construction and it seems that most of the PPE -- I think 24 things are changing and evolving a little bit with 25

manufacturers, but just in, you know, the transition
period, it's just something that I hope that Cal/OSHA
Enforcement keeps in mind when they're doing inspections,
and sometimes the PPE just isn't available for certain
sizes and types, body types. So thanks. I'll be back.
ACTING CHAIR CRAWFORD: Thank you.

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Is there anyone else that's going to speak on this topic in the building?

John, would you go to anyone online. MR. ROENSCH: Thank you, Madam Chair.

At this time, we have no preregistered commenters for this topic. However, our online WebEx audience is at number 76 and so we'd like to invite anyone that would like to make a comment from our WebEx community of attendees today to raise their hand using the tool at the bottom of your WebEx screen to be able to alert us to your desire to make a comment.

18 If you'd like to make a comment on this topic, 19 please raise your hand now.

20 We do have a comment, a hand raised, from 21 Michael Wissig.

22 Mr. Wissig, please unmute your microphone and 23 you can address the board.

24 MR. WISSIG: Hi, Board. Just a couple of quick 25 comments. Traditional personal protective equipment associated with working at height and working at elevation comes in a couple of formats and I just want to make sure that there is due consideration to where the limitations of that PPE lie and that the standard comes into effect to acknowledge that persons existing outside of that parameter -- for example, a person that is over the weight capacities of the equipment -- that we have wording in there that allows for the parameters of the equipment currently available to be considered rather than that it's exclusion-based.

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Obviously we have a lot of science surrounding the impacts and injuries associated with falls from heights even wearing the appropriate personal protective equipment and that if it is designed incorrectly or if we start with every person is allowed to complete these tasks and that we have to provide PPE to them but rather than exclusion and making sure that, you know, we're walking on the appropriate line there.

20 MR. ROENSCH: Does that conclude your remarks,
21 Mr. Wissig?
22 MR. WISSIG: Yes, sir.
23 MR. ROENSCH: Very good. Thank you.

ACTING CHAIR CRAWFORD: Thank you, Mr. Wissig. MR. ROENSCH: Madam Chair, at this time, we have no

1	further hands raised and no preregistered commenters for
2	this topic.
3	ACTING CHAIR CRAWFORD: Thank you.
