

# CAC Handout Legislative Committee April 24, 2018

## ASSEMBLY BILLS

### AB 101

**(Ting D) Education.**

**Current Text:** Amended: 6/12/2017

**Introduced:** 1/10/2017

**Last Amend:** 6/12/2017

**Status:** 7/20/2017-Ordered to inactive file at the request of Senator Mitchell.

**Summary:** Current law provides for the attendance of apprentices at high schools, unified school districts, regional occupational centers or programs, community colleges, and adult schools under vocational education program standards that are established with the participation of the State Department of Education, the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges, and the Division of Apprenticeship Standards of the Department of Industrial Relations. Current law establishes standards for the provision of state funding and reimbursements for these programs at local educational agencies, as defined, separate from these programs at community colleges. This bill would, among other things, require the Controller to include instructions necessary to enforce provisions governing apprenticeship programs at local educational agencies in a specified audit guide.

### AB 118

**(Committee on Budget) Transportation.**

**Current Text:** Amended: 6/26/2017

**Introduced:** 1/10/2017

**Last Amend:** 6/26/2017

**Status:** 2/15/2018-Re-referred to Com. on B. & F.R.

**Summary:** Would require the Department of Transportation to develop and submit to the Legislature and specified legislative caucuses, by January 1, 2019, a detailed outreach plan intended to increase procurement opportunities for new and limited contracting small business enterprises, as defined, including, but not limited to, those owned by women, minority, disabled veterans, LGBT, and other disadvantaged groups, in all the department's transportation programs, to undertake specified outreach activities required to be included in the plan, and to update that plan and submit it to specified entities.

### AB 1275

**(Irwin D) Department of Veterans Affairs: monitoring outcomes for veterans: Director of Employment Development: disclosure of information.**

**Current Text:** Introduced: 2/17/2017

**Introduced:** 2/17/2017

**Status:** 9/1/2017-Failed Deadline pursuant to Rule 61(a)(12). (Last location was APPR. SUSPENSE FILE on 8/21/2017)(May be acted upon Jan 2018)

**Summary:** Would require the Department of Veterans Affairs to develop outcome and related indicators for veterans, for the purpose of assessing the status of veterans in California, for monitoring the quality of programs intended to serve those veterans, and to guide decision making on how to improve those services. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

**AB 1425**

**(Kalra D) Apprentices.**

**Current Text:** Amended: 3/28/2017

**Introduced:** 2/17/2017

**Last Amend:** 3/28/2017

**Status:** 9/7/2017-Ordered to inactive file at the request of Senator Bradford.

**Summary:** Current law requires contractors on public works projects to comply with various requirements for employing apprentices, including, among others, requiring every contractor to submit contract award information to an applicable apprenticeship program that can supply apprentices to the site of the public work. Current law imposes penalties for a violation of requirements relating to apprentices. This bill would require a contractor, within a designated time period, to provide specific written information to applicable apprenticeship committees whose geographic area of operation includes the area of the public works project.

**AB 1743**

**(O'Donnell D) California Career Technical Education Incentive Grant Program.**

**Current Text:** Amended: 4/11/2018

**Introduced:** 1/3/2018

**Last Amend:** 4/11/2018

**Status:** 4/12/2018-Re-referred to Com. on APPR.

**Summary:** Current law establishes the California Career Technical Education Incentive Grant Program, administered by the State Department of Education, with the purpose of encouraging and maintaining the delivery of career technical education programs during implementation of the school district and charter school local control funding formula. Current law appropriates specified amounts for the program from the General Fund for the 2015–16, 2016–17, and 2017–18 fiscal years, and provides minimum eligibility standards for grant applicants. This bill would instead specify that the purpose of the program is to encourage and maintain the delivery of high-quality career technical education programs.

**AB 1786**

**(Cervantes D) Community colleges: academic credit for prior military experience.**

**Current Text:** Amended: 3/20/2018

**Introduced:** 1/8/2018

**Last Amend:** 3/20/2018

**Status:** 4/4/2018-Coauthors revised.

**Summary:** Current law requires the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges, using common course descriptors and pertinent recommendations of the American Council on Education, to determine, by July 1, 2015, for which courses credit should be awarded for prior military experience. This bill would instead require a statewide articulation officer at the Office of the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges, who would be designated by the chancellor under the bill's provisions by March 31, 2019, to, using common course descriptors and pertinent recommendations of the American Council on Education, determine, by July 1, 2019, for which courses credit should be awarded for prior military experience.

**AB 1806** (Ting D) **Budget Act of 2018.**  
**Current Text:** Introduced: 1/10/2018  
**Introduced:** 1/10/2018  
**Status:** 1/29/2018-Referred to Com. on BUDGET.  
**Summary:** This bill would make appropriations for the support of state government for the 2018–19 fiscal year. This bill contains other related provisions.

**AB 1904** (Cervantes D) **Income taxes: credits: apprenticeships.**  
**Current Text:** Amended: 3/15/2018  
**Introduced:** 1/22/2018  
**Last Amend:** 3/15/2018  
**Status:** 4/4/2018-In committee: Set, first hearing. Referred to APPR. suspense file.  
**Summary:** Would for taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2019, and before January 1, 2023, would allow a credit against the taxes imposed under the Personal Income Tax Law and the Corporation Tax Law in an amount equal to \$1 for each hour a registered apprentice worked in the taxable year, up to \$1,000 each for up to 10 registered apprentices, as defined, trained by the taxpayer in the taxable year. This bill would provide that the credit would have an aggregate cap of \$10,000,000 for each calendar year.

**AB 2126** (Eggman D) **California Conservation Corps: forestry corps program.**  
**Current Text:** Amended: 3/15/2018  
**Introduced:** 2/8/2018  
**Last Amend:** 3/15/2018  
**Status:** 4/10/2018-From committee: Do pass and re-refer to Com. on APPR. (Ayes 10. Noes 0.) (April 9). Re-referred to Com. on APPR.  
**Summary:** Current law establishes the California Conservation Corps in the Natural Resources Agency and requires the corps to implement and administer the conservation corps program. Current law requires the Governor to appoint a director to act as the administrative officer of the corps. This bill would require the director, no later than July 1, 2019, to establish a forestry corps program to accomplish certain objectives including developing and implementing forest health projects, as provided, and establishing forestry corps crews. The bill would require the director, no later than January 1, 2020, to establish 2 forestry corps crews, one to be based at the Delta Center and the other at the Inland Empire Center.

**AB 2358** (Carrillo D) **Apprenticeships: discrimination: prohibition.**  
**Current Text:** Amended: 4/16/2018  
**Introduced:** 2/13/2018  
**Last Amend:** 4/16/2018  
**Status:** 4/17/2018-Re-referred to Com. on L. & E.  
**Summary:** Would expressly prohibit discrimination in any building and construction trades apprenticeship program on the basis of certain enumerated categories, including, race, sex, religious creed, or national origin, with regard to acceptance into, or participation in, the program, as specified. The bill, among other things, would require an apprenticeship program to designate one or more individuals to oversee the commitment to equal opportunity in the program and to maintain records regarding compliance with certain requirements, as specified.

**AB 2767**

**(Medina D) California Community Colleges: funding formula: study.**

**Current Text:** Amended: 4/3/2018

**Introduced:** 2/16/2018

**Last Amend:** 4/3/2018

**Status:** 4/4/2018-Re-referred to Com. on HIGHER ED.

**Summary:** Current law authorizes the establishment of community college districts under the administration of community college governing boards and authorizes these districts to provide instruction at community college campuses throughout the state. Current law requires the board of governors to develop criteria and standards, in accordance with specified statewide minimum requirements, for the purposes of making the annual budget request for the California Community Colleges to the Governor and the Legislature and allocating state general apportionment revenues. This bill would require the Legislative Analyst's Office to conduct a study of the funding formula used to allocate state apportionments by the California Community Colleges for the 2017–18 fiscal year.

**AB 3231**

**(Gray D) California Apprenticeship Council: report.**

**Current Text:** Introduced: 2/16/2018

**Introduced:** 2/16/2018

**Status:** 3/15/2018-Referred to Com. on L. & E.

**Summary:** Current law also establishes the California Apprenticeship Council within the Division of Apprenticeship Standards and requires the council to aid the director in formulating policies with respect to apprentice regulation. Current law requires the Chief of the Division of Apprenticeship Standards and the California Apprenticeship Council to report annually through the Director of Industrial Relations on the activities of the division and the council, and further requires that the report include specified information with respect to apprenticeship programs in this state. This bill would require the report to include an analysis of any apprenticeship standards or regulations that were proposed or adopted in the previous year.

**SENATE BILLS**

**SB 54**

**(De León D) Law enforcement: sharing data.**

**Current Text:** Chaptered: 10/5/2017

**Introduced:** 12/5/2016

**Last Amend:** 9/11/2017

**Status:** 10/5/2017-Approved by the Governor. Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter 495, Statutes of 2017.

**Summary:** Current law provides that when there is reason to believe that a person arrested for a violation of specified controlled substance provisions may not be a citizen of the United States, the arresting agency shall notify the appropriate agency of the United States having charge of deportation matters. This bill would repeal those provisions.

**SB 825**

**(Beall D) State prisons: preapprenticeship program.**

**Current Text:** Amended: 3/12/2018

**Introduced:** 1/3/2018

**Last Amend:** 3/12/2018

**Status:** 4/13/2018-Set for hearing April 23.

**Summary:** Would require the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation to develop guidelines for inmate participation in preapprenticeship training programs, as specified. The bill would also require the department to coordinate with local state-approved apprenticeship programs and local building trade councils so that inmates who complete an inmate preapprenticeship program have a pathway to employment upon release.

**SB 839**

**(Mitchell D) Budget Act of 2018.**

**Current Text:** Introduced: 1/10/2018

**Introduced:** 1/10/2018

**Status:** 1/11/2018-From printer.

**Summary:** This bill would make appropriations for the support of state government for the 2018–19 fiscal year. This bill would declare that it is to take effect immediately as a Budget Bill.

**SB 1211**

**(Anderson R) Income taxes: credits: apprenticeships.**

**Current Text:** Introduced: 2/15/2018

**Introduced:** 2/15/2018

**Status:** 3/1/2018-Referred to Com. on GOV. & F.

**Summary:** For taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2019, and before January 1, 2024, would allow a credit against the taxes imposed under those tax laws in an amount equal to 50% of wages paid in the taxable year to an apprentice or \$2,500, whichever is lesser, in the first year of a two-year term of a qualified apprenticeship program, as provided. This bill contains other related provisions.

**SB 1354**

**(Galgiani D) Community colleges: California Apprenticeship Initiative (CAI) New and Innovative Grant Program.**

**Current Text:** Introduced: 2/16/2018

**Introduced:** 2/16/2018

**Status:** 4/17/2018-Read second time. Ordered to consent calendar.

**Summary:** Current law establishes community college districts, administered by governing boards, throughout the state, and authorizes these districts to provide instruction to students at the community college campuses maintained by the districts. Upon appropriation by the Legislature for its purposes, this bill would establish a grant program, under the administration of the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges, to create new and innovative apprenticeship opportunities in priority and emerging industry sectors or areas in which apprenticeship training is not fully established or does not exist.
