### Updates:

There is a lot to be optimistic with apprenticeship funding as California wraps up its 2021-2022. This comes on top of the proposed federal budget investments which will begin on October 1, 2021 fiscal year. The 2021-2022 state budget provides more than \$170 million in workforce funding that will directly impact registered apprenticeship.

The California Community College's Chancellor's Office received funding for additional California Apprenticeship Initiative and a modest increase for Proposition 98 funding for related and supplemental instruction. In June, the Department successful received a \$10 million grant to expand registered regional apprenticeship sponsorships at local workforce investment boards.

The California Workforce Development Board (CWDB) receives \$100 million for its work to develop high road training partnerships. This funding includes that one out of every three person served be by a registered apprenticeship. The CWDB also receives an additional \$20 million for residential construction projects. The Governor is making a commitment to more affordable housing, which includes building at state owned-properties not being used.

The Employment Training Panel receives \$50 million to fund earn and learn models. This funding comes without restrictions in the past. As such, non-profit employers and government programs that have a high road apprenticeship model may be eligible for these funds.

On the federal front, President Biden is proposing a significant investment at the federal level for the federal fiscal year 2021-2022 budget. First, there is a proposal to increase US DOL ETA OA by \$100 million for next year from \$185 million to \$285 million. President Biden proposes \$5 billion over the next 3 years to expand registered apprenticeships across the country in his America

Jobs Plan. Finally, the National Apprenticeship Reauthorization Act is currently at the upper house that could infuse over \$10 billion dollars over the next 10 years.

DAS launched its Tableau feature to internal staff. This allows DAS to easily capture California Apprenticeship System data in formats that include heat maps, pie charts and bar graphs. DAS is working on providing a solution to put Tableau data on our DAS website for public use. Deputy Chief Glen Forman is working with DIR's information technology team.

# Programs:

The DAS has four (4) new programs approved during the last quarter. They are:

- City College of San Francisco Early Childhood Development Apprenticeship Program, for the occupation of Early Education Instructional Aide (Apprentice)
- Simply Youth Institute's Program (SAGACITY) for the Healthcare industry (Preapprenticeship)
- VETAP Pre-Apprenticeship, for the Agriculture industry (Preapprenticeship)
- Woz U Technical Pre-Apprenticeship, for the Information Technology industry (Preapprenticeship)

# Federal Grants

The SAE Consolidated grant (Approximately \$3.5 Million) was closed out this past March 30, 2021. This grant was very successful in meeting the goals of expanding apprenticeship in California. Since the effective date of the SAE grant(s) on June 30, 2016, the total number of apprentices served by SAE grant funding was 135,185. The 135,185 apprentices registered after the grant effective date of the grant(s) represents an increase of approximately 1,272 percent of the grant performance target of 15% of the baseline number (10,627) for new apprentices served under the SAE grant(s).

The SAE Consolidated grant funding also allowed the enhancement of the Division of Apprenticeship Standards (DAS) database system and the development of an internet-based registration system. The DAS on-line registration allows apprenticeship/pre-apprenticeship programs to submit agreements, completions and cancellations electronically, which in turn eliminates the use of paper forms and greatly increases accuracy, efficiency and record keeping for both the apprenticeship/pre-apprenticeship programs and DAS. The new DAS on-line registration system is working very well and most of the programs utilizing the system have found it overall, a positive experience. The DAS on-line registration system is simple to use and streamlines the entire apprentice/pre-apprentice registration process.

DAS has also was awarded a Technology grant in the amount of \$450,000.00 that has been used to enhance DAS ability to Identify and implement specific technical assistance (TA) strategies that change existing or create new effective processes and/or services, in the delivery of TA to sponsors for the purposes of increasing efficiency, improving overall impact, and removing barriers in expanding Registered Apprentice Programs (RAPs). The grant funding shall help enhance system alignment and achieve partnership goals to increase integration and alignment with existing Community Workforce Development Boards and their partners, to include alignment with state and local plans. This funding will allow DAS to better capture demographic data across all workforce sectors that will align with the State's Biannual Workforce Plan.

On July 1, 2021, DAS was awarded a \$10 million State Apprenticeship Expansion, Equity, and Innovation Grant (SAEEI) grant. This grant will deliver at least 1,500 new apprentices with diversity, inclusion, and equity as a key strategy. The equity goals include serving at least 60% people of color, 40% women, and 10% people with disabilities and justice-involved. The DAS shall use the SAEEI funding to contract with at least four Regional Local Workforce Development Boards (Local Boards) to develop and operate multi-employer apprenticeships. The Local Boards may contract with apprenticeship intermediaries to help the program sponsor administer the program, provide outreach services to help the expansion efforts in targeted industries, recruit under-represented populations such as women, people of color, veterans, justice-involved, people with disabilities, youth, and the multitude of unemployed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Local Boards' focus will be to promote diversity, equity, and inclusion.

### Statistics of June 30, 2021 this Committee / California total

The active apprentices numbered 15,608 / 90,860

New registrations and reinstatements numbered 1,711 / 8,695 for the quarter.

Minorities represented 75.3% / 69.7% of all active apprentices.

Active women apprentices numbered **4,158** / **6,618**, which is **26.6%** / **7.3%** of all active apprentices.

There are currently 910 / 9,157 veterans active, 169 / 2,157 of which registered and 138 / 1,740 completed in 2021.

# Program Evaluations April 1, 2021 through June 30, 2021:

Since April 1, 2021, DAS opened ten (10) apprenticeship program evaluations. In the first quarter, DAS completed six (6) evaluations (listed in the New Evaluations Table). There are thirteen (13) programs with corrective action needed (one (1) opened in 2019, twelve (12) opened in 2020), and eleven (11) program evaluations are in progress. DAS consultants are monitoring these programs to ensure their recommendations are completed.

DAS will continue to send new evaluation notification letters one year following the creation of a new program or substantial expansion of an existing program. To ensure high-quality

apprenticeship administration, consultants will assist apprenticeship programs with correcting the deficiencies found in order to close their evaluations/reviews.
