- Crisis Intervention Services: 24-hour, 7-day-a-week confidential telephone crisis line
- Follow-up Services: Confidential client/survivor contact to ensure continuity of services
- Individual Counseling Services: Advocacy and support for accessing in-person counseling services.
- Group Counseling Services: Confidential support groups for sexual assault survivors.
- Accompaniment & Advocacy Services: Confidential support & advocacy for sexual assault survivors by being physically present, advocating during meetings or appointments.
- Information and Referral: Provision of sexual assault-related information.
- Community Education

BAWAR agrees to serve as a resource for sexual assault-related client/survivor referrals from BSP's Ya Basta Center. This referral agreement will be effective from June 1, 2023 - December 31, 2024, with the ability to extend or renew beyond this date.
