

ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT

between the



International Brotherhood of
**BOILERMAKERS, IRON SHIP BUILDERS,
BLACKSMITHS, FORGERS AND HELPERS**
AFL-CIO, CLC

and the

SIGNATORY CONTRACTORS

Effective October 1, 2014
Terminating September 30, 2017

9 Art. 4(b) "It shall be within the Boilermakers'
10 jurisdiction that the unloading and loading
11 of materials which the Boilermakers are to
12 erect; if such materials are shaken out, sepa-
13 rated, segregated, and stored for any period of
14 time. When said material is again loaded and
15 unloaded on a conveyance and transported to
16 the job for erection it shall be unloaded and
17 erected by the Boilermakers."

18 Art. 4(c) In joint review of the above, it was
19 agreed that the following shall apply:

20 Art. 4(d) The Union wishes only to protect and
21 not to expand, its historical jurisdiction over
22 unloading and loading of Boilermaker materi-
23 als. Also, the Union's claims are not extended to
24 apply to material that is in trans-shipment at a
25 transfer point.

26 Art. 4(e) The Contractor agrees that he will not
27 sub-contract such work for the purpose of
28 encroaching on the historical jurisdiction of
29 the Union.

30 Art. 4(f) In the event a disagreement or dispute
31 arises with regard to the historical jurisdiction

1 as outlined in the Union's claim, each specific
2 case may be processed between the Union and
3 such Contractor involved in accordance with
4 the governing language of the Agreement.

5 Art. 4(g) The work of the Boilermaker
6 (Journeyman or Mechanic) shall include:
7 Boilermaking, Welding, Acetylene Burning,
8 Signaling, Loading, Unloading, Heating,
9 Chipping, Caulking, Rigging, Riveting,
10 Bucking-up, Fitting up, Grinding, Scaffold
11 Erecting, Reaming, Impact Machine Operating
12 and such other work as is generally regarded as
13 Boilermaker (Journeyman or Mechanic) work.
14 Any employee classified as a Boilermaker shall
15 perform any of the foregoing work of which
16 he is capable. A Helper may not perform lay-
17 out work, certified welding, crane signaling,
18 or supervise in any capacity. A Helper may
19 perform any other work in which he or she is
20 capable.
