Issue Date: October 2, 2019

Expiration date of Determination: January 26, 2020** The rate to be paid for work performed after this date has been determined. If work will extend past this date, the new rate must be paid and should be incorporated in contracts entered into now. Locality: All localities within Los Angeles County

This determination applies to projects advertised for bids on or after October 12, 2019. These rates supersede the Electrician rates issued in General Prevailing Wage Determination LOS-2019-2.

^a In addition, an amount equal to 3% of the basic hourly rate is added to the total hourly rate and overtime hourly rates for the national employees benefit board. Pursuant to labor code sections 1773.1 and 1773.8, the amount paid for this employer payment may vary resulting in a lower taxable basic hourly wage rate, but the total hourly rates for straight time and overtime may not be less than the general prevailing rate of per diem wages.

^b Included in straight-time hourly rate.

^c Rate applies to the first 4 daily overtime hours; all other time is paid at the Sunday and holiday overtime hourly rate. Effective 1/27/2020, rate applies to the first 2 daily overtime hours; all other overtime is paid at the Sunday/Holiday rate.

^d Rate applies to the first 12 hours worked on Saturday; all other time is paid at the Sunday and holiday overtime hourly rate. Effective 1/27/2020, rate applies to the first 10 hours worked on Saturday; all other overtime is paid at the Sunday/Holiday rate.

^e Saturday hours worked are paid at non-shift differential rate.

^f Sunday and Holiday hours worked are paid at the non-shift differential rates.

^g The maximum allowable ratio is one transportation systems technician to one journeyman on each job.

**** Predetermined Increases**

Transportation Systems Electrician (All Shifts), Transportation Systems Electrician (Cable Splicing, Welding, And NETA Testing) (All Shifts)-

Effective January 27, 2020, there will be an increase of \$1.70 to be allocated to wages and/or fringes.

Effective July 27, 2020, there will be an increase of \$1.85 to be allocated to wages and/or fringes.

Effective February 1, 2021, there will be an increase of \$1.90 to be allocated to wages and/or fringes.

Effective July 26, 2021, there will be an increase of \$2.05 to be allocated to wages and/or fringes.

Effective January 31, 2022, there will be an increase of \$2.10 to be allocated to wages and/or fringes.

Transportation Systems Technician (All Shifts)-

Effective January 27, 2020, there will be an increase of \$1.27 to be allocated to wages and/or fringes.

Effective July 27, 2020, there will be an increase of \$1.39 to be allocated to wages and/or fringes.

Effective February 1, 2021, there will be an increase of \$1.42 to be allocated to wages and/or fringes.

Effective July 26, 2021, there will be an increase of \$1.54 to be allocated to wages and/or fringes.

Effective January 31, 2022, there will be an increase of \$1.57 to be allocated to wages and/or fringes.

There are no further increases applicable to this determination.

RECOGNIZED HOLIDAYS: Holidays upon which the general prevailing hourly wage rate for Holiday work shall be paid, shall be all holidays in the collective bargaining agreement, applicable to the particular craft, classification, or type of worker employed on the project, which is on file with the Director of Industrial Relations. If the prevailing rate is not based on a collectively bargained rate, the holidays upon which the prevailing rate shall be paid shall be as provided in Section 6700 of the Government Code. TRAVEL AND/OR SUBSISTENCE PAYMENT: In accordance with Labor Code Sections 1773.1 and 1773.9, contractors shall make travel and/or subsistence payments to each worker to execute the work.
