PROPOSED REGULATIONS AND ADDITION OF NEW

PUBLIC WORKS CONTRACTOR REGISTRATION

**Title 8, California Code of Regulations, Sections 16410
through 16418**

Pursuant to the requirements of Government Code section 11346.8(c) and section 44 of Title 1 of the California Code of Regulations, the Chief Deputy Director of the Department of Industrial Relations, as Acting Director of the Department ("Director"), is providing this notice of modifications to the text of the proposed regulations that were issued on February 15, 2019, and were the subject of a public hearing held in Los Angeles, California on April 2, 2019. Pursuant to Government Code Section 11347.1, the Director is also adding to the rulemaking record and making available for public comment an Addendum to the Initial Statement of Reasons.

Further modifications have been made to proposed sections 16410, 16411, 16412, 16413, and 16414. Authority and reference notes have also been added to all sections. The text of the further modifications and the Addendum to the Initial Statement of Reasons are being provided to interested parties with this notice.
