

## CA Medical Payments/Claim Mostly Stable Since 2016, Including Little Change 2019/20-2021/22




Non-COVID-19 Claims With > 7 Days Of Lost Time At Various Claim Maturities, Not Adjusted For Injury/Industry Mix



#### Many Study States Experienced Decrease In Surgery Rate Since 2019; CA Decrease Similar To Prior Years




## % Of CA Claims With Facility Services Decreased Since 2016; Payments Per Claim Increased


#### 2019–2021: CA Decreases In % Of Claims With Facility Services & Hospital Services Smaller Than Other States








## Key Driver Of Stability In CA Medical Pmts./Claim Since 2016: Little Change In Nonhospital Pmts.






## 24 Months: Rapid Decreases In CA Prescription (Rx) Payments Per Claim Ended After 2018




#### CA Medical Payments Per All Paid Claims Were 12% Lower Than Median Study State For 2019/22 Claims




## Overall Prices Paid For Professional Services In CA Were Lower Compared With Other Study States

#### CA Fee Schedule For Professional Services Among The Lowest Nationwide


