CAC-LEGISLATION STANDING COMMITTEE MEETING

MINUTES

Wednesday – October 24, 2007 2:30 p.m.

I. Call To Order/ Roll Call

CAC Chairperson Dina Kimble called the meeting to order.

Review/Approval of the minutes of July 25, 2007

II. Bills that were signed by the Governor:

- AB 347 Pupils High School Exit Examination; Middle & High School supplemental counseling program that they would meet with individual students and notify them of opportunities including career technical education.
- AB 428 High School Curriculum; Notification regarding college prep courses, requires school districts 9 – 12 to notify guardians of any student about courses that satisfy requirements for admission to the California State colleges
- AB 597; develop a CT website for the Department of Education
- SB 13; School facilities funding process CTE facilities will require that any secondary program seeking funding for a new facility will have to respond that they will have a CTE program and if not how will they address the need for a career program in their school.
- SB 405; Schools curriculum opportunity for pupils
- SB 52; Teacher credentialing designated subjects. Requires the commission on Teacher credentialing to establish a list of authorized subjects for the credential.
- SB 859; Teacher Credentialing visiting faculty permit.

The following Bills were vetoed:

- AB 400; Public School accountability
- AB 598; Career Technical Education, would allow community college instructors and or Apprenticeship instructors to teach classes at the High School level.
- AB 666; Pupil instruction, home economics, and CTE.

The following Bills are still pending, and will not be discussed again unless there is action on them:

- AB 1414
- AB 876
- AB 947
- AB 974
- AB 675
- SB 681

We will continue to monitor the following Bills:

AB734; Apprenticeship Oversight.

New rules for audits of programs by DAS. Eliminated the needs tests. This requires that programs provide information on OGT hours to Apprentices, require programs to submit monthly data relating to Apprentices in electronic format. Moved to Inactive in the Assembly on 9/12/07.

AB 806; Career Technical Education, Board of Governors of community colleges would provide assistance and require adult schools to collaborate with colleges to provide CTE.

SB 21; Education: The regional education and economic integration initiative.

SB 312; Public Utilities: Excludes certification for lineman on the Utility electrical transmission or distribution system. Changes the definition of electrician for certification requirements. Committee has indicated that the definition changes will be stricken from the Bill if passed due to the controversial nature of the changes.

SB 314; CTE Advisory Committee. Every school district is required and existing CTE Advisory Committee. The bill changes the make up of the committee to include more members of the Building Trades and Industries.
