## RELATED SUPPLEMENTAL INSTRUCTION COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

Wednesday –October 26, 2011

### I. Call To Order/ Roll Call

Chairman McGinn opened the meeting at 9:05 a.m.

Members present: Pat McGinn, Paul Von Berg, Anne Quick, Yvonne de la Pena and Deputy Chief Glen Forman

A quorum was met.

Members absent: Aram Hodess, Van Ton-Quinlivan, Neil Struthers (A) and Chief Diane Ravnik

Review/Approval of the minutes of April 27, 2011

A motion to approve the minutes as written was made and seconded. All approved. The motion was carried.

### II. Montoya Funding

Chairman McGinn introduced Art Webster as one of the people involved in the Montoya Funding at the beginning of its introduction. Mr. Webster is responsible for writing the “White Paper” for the State Assembly on Apprenticeship. Mr. Webster has a long list of apprenticeship activities on his resume from being appointed by Governor Brown, of the previous administration, to the California Advisory council on vocational Education and served as chairman for two years, he worked with the U.S. Department of Labor Woman’s Bureau to promote women for non-traditional occupations, to being inducted into the California Apprenticeship Hall of Fame in January 2004.

Mr. Webster gave a brief history of the creation of the Montoya Bill and RSI Funding. He closed in encouraging the attendees to oppose the Recommendation 8.1 that would consolidate categorical funding by submitting their comments to the Chancellor’s office.
- John Dunn, California Department of Education related the status of apprenticeship funding in the K-12 system.
- Dr. Barry Noonan, California Community College Chancellor’s Office, spoke on the Task Force on Student Success Recommendation No. 8.1 that will consolidate four workforce revenue streams from Apprenticeship, nursing support, career technical education and economic and workforce development into one fund category. That the individual college boards

would be free to spend those dollars within those four program anyway they see fit.
