17	The above-captioned matter, a petition to determine
18	controversy under Labor Code §1700.44, came on regularly for
19	hearing on June 30, 2005 in Los Angeles, California, before the
20	Labor Commissioner's undersigned hearing officer. Petitioners
21	were represented by Jason Tanenbaum, a member of Wondergoat
22	Records, LLC. Respondent was represented by attorney Phillip M.
23	Dezen.
24	At the conclusion of the hearing, a tentative decision was
25	announced. All parties present agreed to comply with this
26	tentative decision, and to waive a written decision. Thus, this
27	matter was settled pursuant to this agreement, under which

28 Respondent was to pay a total of \$1,265.02 as follows:

- 1) \$665.02 to Jason Tanenbaum/Wondergoat Records,
- 2) \$400.00 to the musicians in Cap Gun Suicide, and
- 3) \$200.00 to the musicians in 2 Bucks Short.

No amounts were found due to Stephen De Pace or to the musicians in the Downtown Strutters.

It was agreed that these payments would be made no later than August 1, 2005, and that Jason Tanenbaum would devote his best efforts to ascertaining the full names and addresses of the members of Cap Gun Suicide and 2 Bucks Short, and the way in which the payments should be apportioned among these musicians.

Respondent has now provided a check to the Labor

Commissioner, payable to Jason Tanenbaum/Wondergoat Records, in
the amount of \$665.02. This payment (which is hereby being
transmitted by the Labor Commissioner, along with a copy of this
Dismissal, to Mr. Tanenbaum) satisfies Respondent's obligation
to Jason Tanenbaum and Wondergoat Records.

As for the remaining amounts owed to the musicians in Cap Gun Suicide and 2 Bucks Short, as of yet no information has been provided to Respondent to enable her to make payments to the individuals entitled to receive these funds. Consequently, based on representations made by Respondent's counsel, Phillip M. Dezen, the total of \$600.00 owed to these musicians has been placed and will be held in Mr. Dezen's Client Trust Account, for payment to the appropriate musicians until either: 1) Respondent and Mr. Dezen, with the assistance of Mr. Tanenbaum, can identify the individuals entitled to payment and the amount owed to each such individual, or 2) the Labor Commissioner's office instructs Mr. Dezen to forward this amount, or the remaining portion of

this amount after some but not all eligible persons have been paid, to the Division of Labor Standards Enforcement as trustee for those persons identified as eligible for payment but not located. Based on the settlement of this controversy under the terms set forth hereinabove, the petition to determine controversy is hereby dismissed. 8/16/05 MILES E. Attorney for the Labor Commissioner
