California Labor Code Section 6330 requires that the Director of the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) annually report to the Speaker of the Assembly and the Chairman of the Senate Rules Committee on the activities of the Division of Occupational Safety and Health (the Division). The information below is submitted pursuant to this requirement for calendar year 2015.

Data in this report was a combination of the Federal Integrated Management Information System (IMIS) and a new system OSHA Information System (OIS). The IMIS data was not migrated over to the new OIS system that became effective September 21, 2014. Therefore it required staff to pull data from both systems to get a full year worth of data for a complete picture of the Division's activities.
