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1	(Time noted: 10:01 a.m.)
2	MR. HERSH: Okay. We're going to start.
3	Good morning. Thank you for coming today. My name is
4	Alan Hersh, and I'm Special Counsel with the Division of
5	Workers' Compensation.
6	This is a public hearing for the proposed providers
7	suspension procedure regulations. Essentially, the Division is
8	proposing to adopt regulations regarding the suspension process
9	for physicians, practitioners, and providers who have either
10	been convicted of one of the crimes set forth in Labor Code
11	Section 139.21(a)(1) or suspended due to fraud or abuse for
12	Medicaid or Medicare programs or whose license, certificate, or
13	approval to provide health care has been revoked or
14	surrendered.
15	There are copies of the notice on the front desk.
16	Please make sure you sign in with the sign-in sheet and
17	indicate if you want to testify today.
18	I would like to introduce the other DWC staff that's
19	here today. To my left and your right is George Parisotto, who
20	is the Administrative Director of the Division of Workers'
21	Compensation. And to your left is Maureen Gray, the Division's
22	Regulations Coordinator. Also, we have present two hearing
23	reporters today: Wendy Pun and Julie Mickaelian.
24	When you come up to testify, please give your card to
25	Ms. Gray. All testimony given today will be taken down by the

1 hearing reporter. If you have any written testimony you want to hand in, please give that also to Ms. Gray. If you wish to 2 3 be notified of the final adoption or subsequent changes to the 4 proposed regulations, please provide your complete name and 5 mailing address on the hearing registration attendance sheet 6 located at the sign-in table. The final notice or notice of 7 change to the proposed regulations will be sent to everyone who requests such information. 8

9 I will be calling the names of those who have checked 10 that they want to testify today. I'll also check to see if 11 anyone new has decided to comment, and this hearing will 12 continue as long as there are people present who wish to 13 comment on the regulations but will close at 5:00 o'clock 14 today. If the hearing continues into the lunch hour, we'll 15 take at least an hour's break for lunch. Written comments can also be given to Maureen if you have them with you or will be 16 17 accepted by fax, e-mail, or delivery up to 5:00 p.m. at the 18 Division's offices on the 18th floor of this building.

19 The purpose of this hearing is to receive comments on 20 the proposed regulations, and we welcome any comments you have 21 about them. We will not question, respond to, or discuss 22 anyone's comments, although we may ask for clarification or ask 23 you to elaborate further on any points you are presenting. All 24 your comments, both given here today and those submitted in 25 writing, will be considered in determining what provisions we 1 may make to the regulations if any. Please restrict the 2 subject of your comments to the regulation and to any 3 suggestions you have for changing the proposed regulations. 4 Also, please limit your comments to three minutes in length.

5 So as a reminder, make sure you've signed in, and if 6 you wish to speak, that you check the box indicating that. 7 Again, when you come up to give your testimony, please give Maureen your business card if you have one so that we can get 8 9 the correct spelling of your name into the transcript. And 10 please speak into the microphone, which is at the podium to your right. Actually, it's to my right, to your left. And 11 12 before starting your testimony, please identify yourself on the 13 record.

14 Okay. So will the first speaker please come to the 15 microphone and introduce yourself? And that would be George --16 I'm sorry. No, no, nevermind.

17 That would be Lisa Anne Bickford. 18 -000-19 LISA ANN BICKFORD 20 -000-MS. BICKFORD: Good morning. I'm Lisa Anne Bickford, 21 22 Government Relations for Coventry. My remarks will be very 23 brief. 24 Just as a practical matter, for us to correctly

25 identify the suspended providers, we've had some issues thus

1 far, since there are no license numbers provided or NPIs or any type of specific numeric identifier. It has been a challenge 2 3 for us on the bill-review side to make sure that we are 4 accurately identifying the providers that have been suspended, 5 and we would love the Division to contemplate going forward, when notifications are provided, if some sort of specific 6 7 numeric identifier could be included. Specifically, the medical license number would be very helpful. Use of address 8 9 is not hugely helpful for us because often they move around, 10 they have multiple addresses, et cetera. It sometimes creates some confusion for us on the implementation side. 11

12 And I would also say we've had similar feedback from 13 our NPNs. We administer NPNs for many of our clients. Of 14 course we are policing our networks to make sure we have the 15 appropriate provider in our networks. And again, we want to 16 make sure we are identify the bad actors that the Division is 17 removing from the workers' compensation system. We're already 18 doing the best we can with the information that's provided, but 19 the greater the level of specificity, the easier it will be for 20 us to make sure we're doing this accurately.

Another piece of feedback I had is recently, the Division has added retroactive type of suspensions looking back at the medical licenses that were removed in the past, 2013, 2012, so on. That has made the identification issue that much more challenging for us since these are folks from four or five

1	years ago. It also raises some questions about what happens to
2	all the bills that have happened between the 2012, 2013,
3	whatever that time frame is, and the Division's suspension
4	notification date, which is now in 2017 or whenever it is
5	that's posted on the website. That's kind of raised some
6	confusion there about what happens retrospectively with those
7	bills.
8	MR. HERSH: Okay. Thank you very much. All right.
9	Okay. Those are all the comments that have been
10	requested. Why don't we go off the record for five minutes,
11	take a little break, and see if anybody else shows up or
12	decides they want to add a comment. Then we'll go back on in
13	five minutes, and we'll see where we are. Okay. Thank you.
14	So we're off the record. Thank you.
15	(Off the record.)
16	MR. HERSH: Okay. So this is Alan Hersh again, and we're
17	going back on the record.
18	Is there anyone else who wishes to testify at this
19	hearing?

23	MS. PRZEPIORSKI: Good morning. The five minutes worked
24	well, and we made good use of our time. I'm Diane Przepiorski
25	with the California Orthopedic Association.

In looking at these regs, I'm probably not going to get into the process so much of what the Division goes through when they're going through a suspension process, but there's two points that I'd like to make.

5 Often times, someone that may be doing questionable UR 6 work may come to the attention of some of the stakeholders, and 7 I'm wondering whether or not there would be room for a mechanism in these regs for stakeholders to report a OME or a 8 9 provider to the Division for investigation. So I think that 10 would be a worthwhile addition. Often times too, it's really 11 hard for the stakeholders to learn whether or not a person is 12 working within the QME process or even through the utilization 13 review process, which I know is a bit off topic for today. But 14 I think that it serves all of us to try to report people that 15 we think might have -- might be doing something that we 16 disagree with. And it would be maybe interesting to add that 17 provision here in these regs.

18 And then the second comment that I would like to make 19 is in regard to the appeal process. I know that there's been 20 some investigation of panel QMEs the last couple of years, and 21 it does seem like it's taken a very long time for them to get 22 through the DWC process and to ultimately get to their day in 23 court. So I would like to see Subsection f of -- 9788.3(f) 24 where you talk about the appeal process, I'd like to see that 25 expanded to put in place a very clear process for when the

1 Division -- when someone requests an appeal from their 2 suspension, that there be a very clear process for them to be 3 referred on for their day in court. And I would hope that it would be very timely and follow along the lines of what you've 4 5 laid out here, 10 calendar days for doing different things in 6 the process. 7 So thank you very much. MR. HERSH: Okay. Thank you. 8 9 Okay. Is there anyone else who wishes to testify at 10 the hearing? 11 (No response.) 12 MR. HERSH: All right. If no one else is here to testify, 13 the hearing will be closed. The opportunity to file written 14 comments will stay open until 5:00 p.m. this afternoon, and those comments, again, should be delivered to the 18th floor, 15 16 Office of the DWC in this building. 17 So thank you for your attendance and the input that 18 you've given us, and I want to thank our staff for the work 19 you've done this morning. And the hearing is now closed. 20 (The proceedings adjourned at 10:16 a.m.) 21 22 23 24 25
