MAXIMUS Federal Services has completed the Independent Bill Review (“IBR”) of the above workers’ compensation case. This letter provides you with the IBR Final Determination and explains how the determination was made.

Final Determination: OVERTURN. MAXIMUS Federal Services has determined that additional reimbursement is warranted. The Claims Administrator’s determination is reversed and the Claim Administrator owes the Provider additional reimbursement of \$195.00 for the review cost and \$60.33 in additional reimbursement for a total of \$255.33. A detailed explanation of the decision is provided later in this letter.

The Claim Administrator is required to reimburse the Provider a total of \$255.33 within 45 days of the date on this letter per section 4603.2 (2a) of the California Labor Code. The determination of MAXIMUS Federal Services and its expert reviewer is deemed to be the Final Determination of the Administrative Director of the Division of Workers’ Compensation. This determination is binding on all parties. In certain limited circumstances, you can appeal the Final Determination. Appeals must be filed with the Workers’ Compensation Appeals Board within 20 days from the date of this letter. For more information on appealing the final determination, please see California Labor Code Section 4603.6(f).

HOW THE IBR FINAL DETERMINATION WAS MADE

MAXIMUS Federal Services Chief Coding Specialist reviewed the case file and researched pertinent coding and billing standards to reach a determination. In some cases a physician reviewer was employed to review the clinical aspects of the care to help make a determination. He/she has no affiliation with the employer, employee, providers or the claims administrator. The expert reviewer was selected based on his/her clinical experience, education, background, and expertise in the same or similar specialties that evaluate and/or treat the medical condition and disputed items/services.

ANALYSIS AND FINDING

Based on review of the case file the following is noted:

- **ISSUE IN DISPUTE: Provider seeking reimbursement for CPT 99204.**
- Claims Administrator denied the billed procedure code 99204 with the following rationale: There is no separate facility fee for this service under the California Outpatient Hospital /ASC Fee Schedule Labor code 5307.1.
- The CPT 99204 was billed as part of an urgent care visit on a UB04 claim form with bill type 131.
- Title 8, CCR 9789.32 (a) Sections 9789.30 through 9789.39 shall be applicable to the maximum allowable fees for emergency room visits and surgical procedures rendered on or after July 1, 2004 and before September 1, 2014. Sections 9789.30 through 9789.39 shall be applicable to the maximum allowable fees for emergency room visits, surgical procedures, and Facility Only Services rendered on or after September 1, 2014.
 - (c) The maximum allowable fees for services, drugs and supplies furnished by hospitals and ambulatory surgical centers that do not meet the requirements in (a) for a facility fee payment and are not bundled in the APC payment rate for services in (a) will be determined as follows:
 - (B) For Other Services rendered on or after September 1, 2014 to hospital outpatients, the maximum allowable hospital outpatient facility fees shall be paid according to the **OMFS RBRVS**.

- The submitted medical record did not substantiate the billed code 99204: Level 4 outpatient visit for evaluation and management of new patient with problem of moderate to high severity, including comprehensive history and physical examination, and medical decision making of moderate complexity - typical time with patient and/or family 45 minutes
- The injured worker was seen and treated for a sprained ankle. The medical record demonstrated the required elements of CPT 99202.
 - CPT 99202: Level 2 outpatient visit for evaluation and management of new patient with problem of low to moderate severity, including expanded problem-focused history and physical examination, and straightforward medical decision-making - typical time with patient and/or family 20 minutes
 - Assigned ICD-9 code 845.00
 - The medical record documented a physical exam of the affected area and other related / symptomatic areas; X-Rays of the left foot & Tibia; and prescribed Motrin. Medical decision making was straightforward.
- Reimbursement is recommended for CPT 99202.

DETERMINATION OF ISSUE IN DISPUTE: Recommended reimbursement of code: CPT 99202.
