MAXIMUS Federal Services has completed the Independent Bill Review (“IBR”) of the above workers’ compensation case. This letter provides you with the IBR Final Determination and explains how the determination was made.

Final Determination: OVERTURN. MAXIMUS Federal Services has determined that additional reimbursement is warranted. The Claims Administrator’s determination is reversed and the Claim Administrator owes the Provider additional reimbursement of \$195.00 for the review cost and \$1.66 in additional reimbursement for a total of \$196.66. A detailed explanation of the decision is provided later in this letter.

The Claim Administrator is required to reimburse the Provider a total of \$196.66 within 45 days of the date on this letter per section 4603.2 (2a) of the California Labor Code. The determination of MAXIMUS Federal Services and its expert reviewer is deemed to be the Final Determination of the Administrative Director of the Division of Workers’ Compensation. This determination is binding on all parties. In certain limited circumstances, you can appeal the Final Determination. Appeals must be filed with the Workers’ Compensation Appeals Board within 20 days from the date of this letter. For more information on appealing the final determination, please see California Labor Code Section 4603.6(f).

HOW THE IBR FINAL DETERMINATION WAS MADE

MAXIMUS Federal Services Chief Coding Specialist reviewed the case file and researched pertinent coding and billing standards to reach a determination. In some cases a physician reviewer was employed to review the clinical aspects of the care to help make a determination. He/she has no affiliation with the employer, employee, providers or the claims administrator. The expert reviewer was selected based on his/her clinical experience, education, background, and expertise in the same or similar specialties that evaluate and/or treat the medical condition and disputed items/services.

ANALYSIS AND FINDING

Based on review of the case file the following is noted:

- **ISSUE IN DISPUTE:** Provider seeking remuneration for 99213 on date of service 10/28/2015.
- Claims Administrator reimbursed \$52.93 for CPT 99213 as 99212 with indication "Allowance was reduced as per contractual agreement."
- Provider disputes the PPO discount taken for reimbursement stating a contract does not exist between the two parties.
- Communication to Claims Administrator from Provider dated August 1, 2014 requesting a copy of the contract if one exists.
- A copy of a contract was not submitted for review.
- Provider billed codes 99213 and WC002 on a CMS 1500 form.
- Provider's PR-2 submitted does not support a level 99213 evaluation but does support 99212.
- 99212: Office or other outpatient visit for the evaluation and management of an established patient, which requires at least 2 of these 3 key components: A problem focused history; A problem focused examination; Straightforward medical decision making.
- Opportunity for Claims Administrator to Dispute Eligibility letter sent on 02/24/2016. A response from Claims Administrator was not received for this review.

- Based on information reviewed, additional reimbursement of 99212 is warranted.
