HOW THE IMR FINAL DETERMINATION WAS MADE

MAXIMUS Federal Services sent the complete case file to an expert reviewer. He/she has no affiliation with the employer, employee, providers or the claims administrator. The expert reviewer is Board Certified in Orthopedic Surgeon and is licensed to practice in New York. He/she has been in active clinical practice for more than five years and is currently working at least 24 hours a week in active practice. The expert reviewer was selected based on his/her clinical experience, education, background, and expertise in the same or similar specialties that evaluate and/or treat the medical condition and disputed items/services. He/she is familiar with governing laws and regulations, including the strength of evidence hierarchy that applies to Independent Medical Review determinations.

CLINICAL CASE SUMMARY

The expert reviewer developed the following clinical case summary based on a review of the case file, including all medical records:

The patient has a date of injury of November 4, 2013. The patient has chronic back pain. On physical examination there is tenderness to the lumbar spine motion. There is tenderness to palpation of the lumbar spine. Straight leg raise is positive on the left. Motor exam shows weakness of the EHL tibialis anterior. Patient had MRI lumbar spine which showed disc protrusions at multiple levels from L2-S1. There is no evidence of severe spinal stenosis. At issue is whether lumbar decompressed surgeries are medically necessary.

IMR ISSUES, DECISIONS AND RATIONALES

The Final Determination was based on decisions for the disputed items/services set forth below:

Bilateral interlaminar laminotomy at L1-2: Upheld

Claims Administrator guideline: Decision based on MTUS ACOEM Chapter 12 Low Back Complaints Page(s): 306. Decision based on Non-MTUS Citation Official Disability Guidelines (ODG)

MAXIMUS guideline: The Expert Reviewer did not base their decision on the MTUS. Decision based on Non-MTUS Citation Other Medical Treatment Guideline or Medical Evidence: MTUS low back Chapter, pages 305-322

Decision rationale: This patient does not meet establish criteria for lumbar laminectomy decompressed surgery. Specifically the medical records do not document significant neurologic

deficit that is clearly correlated with imaging studies show severe compression of any nerve roots. Also the patient does not have any red flag indicators such as tumor or fracture. Lumbar laminectomy decompressed surgery is not medically necessary. Criteria for laminectomy not met.
