HOW THE IMR FINAL DETERMINATION WAS MADE

MAXIMUS Federal Services sent the complete case file to an expert reviewer. He/she has no affiliation with the employer, employee, providers or the claims administrator. He/she has been in active clinical practice for more than five years and is currently working at least 24 hours a week in active practice. The expert reviewer was selected based on his/her clinical experience, education, background, and expertise in the same or similar specialties that evaluate and/or treat the medical condition and disputed items/Service. He/she is familiar with governing laws and regulations, including the strength of evidence hierarchy that applies to Independent Medical Review determinations.

CLINICAL CASE SUMMARY

The expert reviewer developed the following clinical case summary based on a review of the case file, including all medical records:

The injured worker is a 58 year old male who sustained an industrial injury on 03/22/04. The initial complaints and diagnoses are not addressed in the submitted documentation. Prior treatments include medications and epidural steroid injections. Prior diagnostic studies are not documented. Current complaints include back and bilateral leg pain. In a progress note dated 10/24/14 the treating provider reports the current plan of care includes another ESI, continued Percocet, Gabapentin, and Tizanidine. The current requested treatment is Tizanidine.

IMR ISSUES, DECISIONS AND RATIONALES

The Final Determination was based on decisions for the disputed items/services set forth below:

Tizanidine 4mg, 1 PO q.h.s. #30: Upheld

Claims Administrator guideline: The Claims Administrator did not cite any medical evidence for its decision.

MAXIMUS guideline: Decision based on MTUS Chronic Pain Treatment Guidelines Muscle relaxants Page(s): 63.

Decision rationale: According to MTUS guidelines, non sedating muscle relaxants is recommended with caution as a second line option for short term treatment of acute

exacerbations in patients with chronic lumbosacral pain. Efficacy appears to diminish over time and prolonged use may cause dependence. The patient was previously treated with Tizanidine for at least more than 4 months, which is considered a prolonged use of the drug. There is no continuous and objective documentation of the effect of the drug on patient pain, spasm and function. There is no recent documentation for recent pain exacerbation or failure of first line treatment medication. Therefore, the request for Tizanidine 4mg #30 is not medically necessary.
