
DECISION

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18 IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the above-
19 entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:

20 PARTIES

21 1. Kimberly Kirchmeyer (Complainant) is the Executive Director of the Medical Board
22 of California (Board). She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is represented in
23 this matter by Kamala D. Harris, Attorney General of the State of California, by Brenda P. Reyes,
24 Deputy Attorney General.

25 2. Frederick L. Becker, Jr., M.D. (Respondent) is represented in this proceeding by
26 attorney Thomas E. Still, Esq., whose address is Hinshaw, Marsh, Still & Hinshaw, LLP, 12901
27 Saratoga Avenue, Saratoga, CA 95070.

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1 3. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board his pocket license and, if one was
2 issued, his wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.

3 4. If Respondent ever files an application for licensure or a petition for reinstatement in
4 the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a petition for reinstatement. Respondent must
5 comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for reinstatement of a revoked license in
6 effect at the time the petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in
7 Accusation No. 800-2015-016331 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondent
8 when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the petition.

9 5. If Respondent should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or
10 petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of
11 California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 800-2015-016331 shall
12 be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent for the purpose of any Statement of
13 Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.

ACCUSATION

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18 Complainant alleges:

19 **PARTIES**

20 1. Kimberly Kirchmeyer (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official
21 capacity as the Executive Director of the Medical Board of California, Department of Consumer
22 Affairs (Board).

23 2. On or about August 15, 1988, the Medical Board issued Physician's and Surgeon's
24 Certificate Number G 63724 to Frederick L. Becker, Jr., M.D. (Respondent). The Physician's and
25 Surgeon's Certificate was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought
26 herein and will expire on October 31, 2017, unless renewed.

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JURISDICTION

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2 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board, under the authority of the following
3 laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.

4 4. Section 2004 of the Code states, in pertinent part:

5 “The board shall have the responsibility for the following:

6 “(a) The enforcement of the disciplinary and criminal provisions of the Medical Practice
7 Act.

8 “(b) The administration and hearing of disciplinary actions.

9 “(c) Carrying out disciplinary actions appropriate to findings made by a panel or an
10 administrative law judge.

11 “(d) Suspending, revoking, or otherwise limiting certificates after the conclusion of
12 disciplinary actions.

13 “(e) Reviewing the quality of medical practice carried out by physician and surgeon
14 certificate holders under the jurisdiction of the board.”

15 5. Section 2227 of the Code provides that a licensee who is found guilty under the
16 Medical Practice Act may have his or her license revoked, suspended for a period not to exceed
17 one year, placed on probation and required to pay the costs of probation monitoring, or such other
18 action taken in relation to discipline as the Board deems proper.

19 6. Section 820 of the Code states:

20 "Whenever it appears that any person holding a license, certificate or permit under this
21 division or under any initiative act referred to in this division may be unable to practice his or her
22 profession safely because the licentiate's ability to practice is impaired due to mental illness, or
23 physical illness affecting competency, the licensing agency may order the licentiate to be
24 examined by one or more physicians and surgeons or psychologists designated by the agency.
25 The report of the examiners shall be made available to the licentiate and may be received as direct
26 evidence in proceedings conducted pursuant to Section 822."

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
