
DECISION AND ORDER

**STIPULATED SURRENDER OF
LICENSE AND ORDER**

19 IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the above-
20 entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:

21 **PARTIES**

22 1. Kimberly Kirchmeyer (Complainant) is the Executive Director of the Medical Board
23 of California (Board). She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is represented in
24 this matter by Xavier Becerra, Attorney General of the State of California, by Christina L. Sein,
25 Deputy Attorney General.

26 2. Renyan Wang, M.D. (Respondent) is representing himself in this proceeding and has
27 chosen not to exercise his right to be represented by counsel.

28 3. On or about May 24, 2001, the Medical Board issued Physician's and Surgeon's
Certificate Number A 51781 to Respondent. The Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate is

1 currently in delinquent status.

2 **JURISDICTION**

3 4. First Amended Accusation No. 800-2014-007236 was filed before the Board and is
4 currently pending against Respondent. The First Amended Accusation and all other statutorily
5 required documents were properly served on Respondent. A copy of First Amended Accusation
6 No. 800-2014-007236 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

7 **ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS**

8 5. Respondent has carefully read, and understands the charges and allegations in First
9 Amended Accusation No. 800-2014-007236. Respondent also has carefully read, and
10 understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.

11 6. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a
12 hearing on the charges and allegations in the First Amended Accusation; the right to be
13 represented by counsel, at his own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses
14 against him; the right to present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right to the
15 issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents;
16 the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded
17 by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.

18 7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and
19 every right set forth above.

20 **CULPABILITY**

21 8. Respondent does not contest that, at an administrative hearing, Complainant could
22 establish a *prima facie* case with respect to the charges and allegations contained in First
23 Amended Accusation No. 800-2014-007236, agrees that cause exists for discipline and hereby
24 surrenders Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate Number A 51781 for the Board's formal
25 acceptance.


26 9. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation he enables the Board to issue
27 an order accepting the surrender of his Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate without further
28 process.

1 4. If Respondent ever files an application for licensure or a petition for reinstatement in
2 the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a petition for reinstatement. Respondent must
3 comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for reinstatement of a revoked license in
4 effect at the time the petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in First
5 Amended Accusation No. 800-2014-007236 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by
6 Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the petition.

7 5. If Respondent should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or
8 petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of
9 California, all of the charges and allegations contained in First Amended Accusation, No. 800-
10 2014-007236 shall be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent for the purpose of
11 any Statement of Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.

13 ACCEPTANCE

14 I have carefully read the Stipulated Surrender of License and Order. I understand the
15 stipulation and the effect it will have on my Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate. I enter into this
16 Stipulated Surrender of License and Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to
17 be bound by the Decision and Order of the Medical Board of California.

FIRST AMENDED ACCUSATION

19 Complainant alleges:

20 **PARTIES**

21 1. Kimberly Kirchmeyer (Complainant) brings this First Amended Accusation solely in
22 her official capacity as the Executive Director of the Medical Board of California, Department of
23 Consumer Affairs (Board).

24 2. On or about May 24, 2001, the Medical Board issued Physician's and Surgeon's
25 Certificate Number A 51781 to Renyan Wang, M.D. (Respondent). The Physician's and
26 Surgeon's Certificate was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought
27 herein and is currently in delinquent status.

1 for an umbilical hernia repair. Anesthesia for the procedure was provided by Respondent.

2 11. Anesthesia start time was 8:35 a.m. Surgery start time was 8:50 a.m. Surgery end
3 time was 9:00 a.m. Anesthesia end time was 9:35 a.m.

4 12. At the start time of the procedure, 8:50 a.m., the patient's oxygen saturation fell to
5 85%. Respondent replaced the laryngeal mask airway with an endotracheal tube. CPR and
6 advanced cardiac life support (ACLS) later followed. The patient was resuscitated and
7 transported to the hospital where he developed a fatal arrhythmia and died on September 29,
8 2011.

9 13. Anesthesiology focuses on, but is not limited to, the preoperative, intraoperative, and
10 postoperative evaluation and treatment of patients who are rendered unconscious and/or
11 insensible to pain and emotional stress during surgical or other medical procedures, clinical
12 management of cardiac and pulmonary resuscitation, and evaluation of respiratory function and
13 application of respiratory therapy.

14 14. The standard of care requires performance of a preanesthesia evaluation involving the
15 assessment of information from multiple sources; including medical records, patient interviews,
16 physical examinations, and findings from preoperative tests. The standard preanesthesia
17 evaluation contains four parts: content, timing, routine preoperative tests, and selective
18 preoperative tests.

19 15. Anesthesia care is a continuum and is viewed as consisting of preanesthesia,
20 intraoperative/procedural anesthesia and post anesthesia components. The standard of care
21 requires that anesthesia care be documented to reflect these components and facilitate review.

22 16. Under the standard of care, anesthesiologists' responsibilities to patients include
23 assessment of, consultation for and preparation of patients for anesthesia, determination of the
24 patient's medical status and developing and prescribing a plan of anesthesia care, medical
25 management of patients and the anesthetic for the planned procedures including obtaining
26 consults as necessary, and postanesthetic evaluation and treatment. Anesthesiologists are also
27 experts in additional areas such as resuscitation procedures.

28 ///

1 17. Respondent's care and treatment of R.F. as set forth above in Paragraphs 10 through
2 17, include the following acts and/or omissions which constitute repeated negligent acts:

3 A. The content of the preanesthesia evaluation lacked Respondent's
4 evaluation of the preoperative cardiac evaluation and his review of R.F.'s medications.

5 B. The intraoperative documentation omitted several pieces of information
6 and therefore lacked accuracy, including the (i) induction dose; (ii) vaporizing agent use; (iii) site
7 of the IV; (iv) placement of the blood pressure cuff; (v) monitoring of the ETCO2; (vi) mode of
8 ventilation; (vii) a 0.2 mg dose of Epinephrine; (viii) pulseless electrical activity (PEA); and (ix)
9 reason for the change from a laryngeal mask airway to an endotracheal tube.

10 C. Respondent's documentation did not accurately document the time and
11 dosage of medications given to R.F.

12 D. Respondent failed to display knowledge of diagnosis of Bupivacaine
13 intravascular injection, PEA, the treatment of PEA, resuscitation procedures as provided in ACLS
14 certification, and drug doses of Epinephrine used in resuscitation.

15 PRAAYER

16 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
17 and that following the hearing, the Medical Board of California issue a decision:

18 1. Revoking or suspending Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate Number A 51781,
19 issued to Renyan Wang, M.D.;

20 2. Revoking, suspending or denying approval of Renyan Wang, M.D.'s authority to
21 supervise physician assistants and advanced practice nurses;

22 3. Ordering Renyan Wang, M.D., if placed on probation, to pay the Board the costs of
23 probation monitoring; and


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4. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
