1 (B) Scope of Agreement

Re: Pilot Car Usage

Dear David,

It is my understanding that the pilot car referenced in the Letter of Understanding refers to a vehicle shuttling non-construction traffic through a work zone, where traffic control signage as well as workers with STOP/SLOW signs control the traffic thru such an area.

Such passage is commonly done with only one active lane for non-construction traffic, which necessitates a 'pace car' (my synonym) to control the speed and protection of regular civilian traffic.

The most common usage of the Teamster's Escort or Pilot Car is for a lead or chase car used in preceding a wide or otherwise oversized load over open roads off a construction sites

I hope that his helps to clarify the matter.
