hearings. The length of the remote hearings has increased

slightly.

Presiding Judge Lewis mentioned that the parties now can present expert witnesses located outside of California who

give extensive testimony which takes more time but does not increase the number of witnesses.

Member Kropke suggested that the efficiency of remote hearings and added information and the accessibility of witnesses might explain the extended time of remote hearings.
