I. Written Comments

Comment:

Mr. Grone stated that NEII fully supports the proposed reduction in the number of paper copies required to support a variance application. Electronic distribution has eliminated the need for additional paper copies of the original. The proposed amendments, if adopted, will reduce the burden and cost of compliance with the administrative process without compromising the

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integrity of the process itself. This is a welcome change in administrative procedures and NEII encourages the OSHSB to adopt the amendments.
