MODIFICATIONS AND RESPONSE TO COMMENTS RESULTING FROM THE 45-DAY PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

Summary of and Responses to Written and Oral Comments:

I. Written Comments

Amber Rose, Area Director, Occupational Safety and Health Administration, by letter dated October 18, 2019.

Comment:

Ms. Rose comments the proposed standards appear to be commensurate with the federal standard.

Response:

The Board thanks Ms. Rose for her comment and participation in the Board's rulemaking process.

Karin Umfrey, Legal Fellow, Worksafe, Inc., by email on November 21, 2019.

Comments:

Ms. Umfrey states that Worksafe, Inc.approves of the substantive and organizational changes to the California Code of Regulations, Title 8, Sections 3420 and 3425: Tree Work, Maintenance or Removal – Use of Portable Power Saws. The substantive changes support a safe and healthy workplace because they will prevent potential injuries. First, defining what drop starting means

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> clarifies for personnel how to be in compliance with the regulation. Second, prohibiting dropstarting of chainsaws can prevent injuries that have happened when operators could not grip firmly the saw while drop-starting it. Defining how power saws should be started clarifies how to safely use the power saw. Also, having a broad provision that requires personnel to ensure no one is below the power saw while being operated protects people, who may be below from potential injuries, if an accident occurs. Worksafe, Inc. approves of the organizational changes because it makes the provisions more cohesive and easier to read.

Response:

The Board thanks Ms. Umfrey for her comments and participation in the Board's rulemaking process.
