3	CHAIR THOMAS: Good morning. This meeting of the Occupational Safety
4	and Health Standards Board is now called to order. I am Dave Thomas, Chairman, and
5	the other Board Members present today are Ms. Barbara Burgel, Occupational
6	Health Representative; Ms. Kathleen Crawford, Management
7	Representative; Mr. David Harrison, Labor Representative; Ms. Nola
8	Kennedy, Public Member; Ms. Chris Laszcz-Davis, Management
9	Representative; and Ms. Laura Stock, Occupational Safety
10	Representative.
11	Also present from our staff for today's meeting are Ms.
12	Christina Shupe, Executive Officer; Ms. Autumn Gonzalez, Chief Counsel;

The Board's variance hearings are administrative hearings where procedural due process rights are carefully preserved. Therefore, we will not grant requests to address the Board on variance matters.

1	At this time, anyone who would like to comment on any
2	matters concerning occupational safety and health will have an
3	opportunity to speak.
4	For our commenters who are native Spanish speakers, we are
5	working with an interpreter, Susan Haikalis, to provide a translation of
6	their statements into English for the Board.
7	At this time, Ms. Haikalis will provide instructions to the
8	Spanish-speaking commenters so they are aware of the public comment
9	process for today's meeting. So, Ms. Haikalis, you may go ahead.

11	Provided in Spanish.]
12	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you, Ms. Haikalis.
13	Mr. Gotcher, do we have any commenters in the queue?
14	MR. GOTCHER: Our first commenter is Pamela Murcell from the
15	California Industrial Hygiene Council.
16	CHAIR THOMAS: Pamela, can you hear us?
17	MS. MURCELL: I can. Hopefully, you can hear me as well?
18	CHAIR THOMAS: Yes we can. Go right ahead.
19	MS. MURCELL: Thank you, Chairman Thomas. This is Pamela Murcell
20	with the California Industrial Hygiene Council. Just a couple of very brief comments this
21	morning.
22	The first one is to express on behalf of the CIHC our thanks at being a
23	party to the COVID ETS advisory committee meetings. I want to thank the Standards
24	Board, but in particular the Division, and Chief Parker and Deputy Chief Berg for the
25	experience, for what I felt was a very productive and informative use of our time. It was

1	incredibly well run and the dialogue that we were able to generate, even via the virtual
2	platform, was very appreciated. So, I wanted to express our thanks for that opportunity
3	and look forward to the revised regulations that come out of that process.
4	Also, I just wanted to make a brief comment on the proposed petition
5	581 decision that's on the business meeting docket for today. The CIHC would support
6	the proposed decision to deny that petition basically for the reasons that are stated in
7	the proposed decision documents. Essentially now, with the COVID ETS, this is really no
8	longer necessary, as those workers are covered by the COVID ETS.
9	Thank you, appreciate everyone's time today.
10	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you, Pamela.
11	John, who do we have next in the queue?
12	MR. GOTCHER: Our next commenter is Bryan Little and I do not have an
13	affiliation for him.
14	CHAIR THOMAS: Bryan, can you hear us?
15	MR. LITTLE: I can. Can you hear me?
16	CHAIR THOMAS: Yes. Yes, we can go right ahead.
17	MR. LITTLE: I'm sorry, I was getting the blue circle of death from
18	Microsoft there for a minute and I wasn't sure if I was on or not.
19	Bryan Little with California Farm Bureau. I participated in the COVID-19
20	ETS advisory committee on Thursday, Friday and Tuesday and am grateful the role that
21	the Standards Board and staff played in that because I think that it was a very
22	constructive exercise. Had a lot of opportunities to talk about things that needed to be
23	addressed. The nature of the emergency regulation was such that it was done quickly
24	and there were things that needed to be ironed out, shall we say.
25	And I think that the agency's looking at some important changes to the

1	regulation and I think that's encouraging. I think there are a few things that probably
2	need to continue to be revisited and we will be submitting comments to address some
3	of those things.
4	And just wanted to close by saying that to offer some good news and
5	some (indiscernible) light at the end of the tunnel which is that our daily case rate
6	averages have dropped about two-thirds, maybe more than that, depending on how you
7	do the math. I was a poli sci major so I can't do math to save my life. But it's a
8	substantial drop since late December. Hopefully that's an indication there's light at the
9	end of the tunnel that isn't a train. So, I just wanted to share that bit of good news and
0	thank you for all of your efforts with the ETS advisory committee. Thank you.
1	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you. Who do we have next in the queue, John?
2	MR. GOTCHER: There are no further commenters in our queue right
13	now, but we are expecting some late submissions.
4	CHAIR THOMAS: All right. So, if you have not put yourself in the queue,
15	please call in and get yourself put in the queue. We'll wait a few minutes to see who
6	comes on board. John, just let me know when you have someone.
17	MR. GOTCHER: Sure. So, I just got word that we aren't receiving any
8	additional requests at the moment.
9	CHAIR THOMAS: All right.
20	MS. SHUPE: At this time, do we have anyone on the meeting who was
21	unable to join the queue, who would like to address the Board?
22	MR. GOTCHER: Okay, we just got one. Our next commenter is Rob
23	Moutrie.
24	CHAIR THOMAS: Rob, are you with us?
25	MR. MOUTRIE: Yes, I am. Can everyone hear me okay?

1	CHAIR THOMAS: Yeah, go right ahead, Rob.
2	MR. MOUTRIE: Thank you. Good morning everyone. Hope you're all
3	safe.
4	So, echoing the prior two commenters, the Cal Chamber was able to
5	participate in this call over the last Thursday, Friday and Tuesday regarding some
6	updates to the regulation. And again, I'd like to echo the thanks to Division staff. They
7	were very thorough. The discussions were productive, I think, on all sides. We had
8	some agreement on a couple of points between management and labor, which was very
9	nice to see, and a very productive discussion.
10	I expect you may have heard this through the vine, but I'll just say that
11	we're hoping that that at least on my side, we're hoping that can get to you all within
12	the next couple of months and those changes can be made, because some of them I
13	think will really improve the effectiveness and the clarity of the reg in productive ways.
14	So, hopefully, you'll be seeing it soon. Thank you.
15	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you, Rob.
16	John, do we have anybody else waiting?
17	MR. GOTCHER: There are no further commenters in our queue.
18	CHAIR THOMAS: Is there anybody else that is in the meeting that would
19	like to make a comment?
20	MR. COSTA: Mr. Chairman, this is Louie Costa with SMART
21	Transportation Division. Can you hear me okay?
22	CHAIR THOMAS: Yeah.
23	MR. COSTA: Okay, we were I'm one of the original petitioners of 581
24	and I just wanted to say that it was the petition was submitted prior to the petition
25	that eventually became the emergency temporary standards. And we're comfortable

1	with the Board's decision and believe that all of our issues were addressed in the
2	emergency temporary standard.
3	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you. Is that the extent of your comments?
4	MR. COSTA: That is the extent. Thank you, sir.
5	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you very much.
6	Is there anybody else that's with us on WebEx that would like to
7	comment?
8	MR. GOTCHER: Yeah, our next commenter is Bruce Wick.
9	CHAIR THOMAS: Bruce.
10	MR. WICK: Good morning Chair Thomas, Board Members, Bruce Wick
11	with the Housing Contractors of California. I just want to augment the comments made
12	by Bryan Little and Rob Moutrie.
13	We were very thankful and appreciate all the work to create, because it is
14	extra work to create an advisory committee made of representatives who can then
15	dialogue, sort of, together. And it was harder, you know, virtually, than typically when
16	we're sitting around a table able to really, you know, dig into issues. But it was very
17	effective, much better than the Division meetings where people are, you know, giving
18	comments. Large numbers of people and you can't really dialogue about the
19	comments. This was very improved.
20	So, I hope the Board will recommend to the Division, whenever they are
21	holding an advisory committee, to take the extra time, like was done. You know, for
22	those of us who weren't part of the committee, we knew, you know, there will be
23	representatives of your group. I've been on many committees and represented others,
24	and this time could only watch. But I knew the people representing the employer side
25	were having real good dialogue with those, you know, on the occupational safety and

1	nearth side, the worker advocates, the labor advocates. It was very, very improved.
2	So, just encourage continue to do that whenever we are doing either a
3	combined sort of advisory or the Division is doing it. This was much improved. And we
4	can gain more ground and feel like everybody got their voices heard. So, just wanted to
5	say thank you for all the work involved.
6	CHAIR THOMAS: Great, thank you Bruce. And I'm really happy to hear
7	that. I know we've got a lot of comments that the advisory committee went well and
8	we're very happy that it did. We want everybody to be able to make their comments
9	and feel like they have an exchange so that the ideas get across.
10	I think, I just got a note from Kevin Bland. Are you there, Kevin? Would
11	you like to speak?
12	MR. BLAND: Yes. I'm sorry, I almost said yes, your honor. I've been on
13	too many calls.
14	Thank you, Chairman, and Board Members and staff. Just briefly, I mean
15	I don't want to keep repeating. But we repeat bad things sometimes, so it's kind of nice
16	maybe to hear good things. And I echo the comments of the previous speakers. Been
17	through a lot of Division advisory committees and by far, this one was leaps and bounds
18	above the others. I know it was a long haul of three solid days, but we feel that it was
19	productive.
20	We appreciate I was fortunate enough to be a member of it. So, I
21	thank the Board and the Division for including me in that as a member. And I'd like in
22	particular, as far as the Board goes, to thank Christina Shupe for her involvement. I
23	found that she was very helpful in guiding some of the procedural issues that came up
24	during the meeting and I was very appreciative. So, just a thank you. We're looking
25	forward to seeing what the results are in the edits to the emergency standard and

1	discussing what we're going to do with timing of adoption, or amendments, and that
2	sort of thing. And then, also, we know we still have to grapple with vaccinations, so we
3	still have that. I think that's going to be an open issue we're going to have to contend
4	with sooner, rather than later.
5	So, thank you very much, appreciate it, and I won't take up any more of
6	your time. This might be my record shortest comment. Thank you.
7	CHAIR THOMAS: Thanks, Kevin. Appreciate that.
8	I think we had another commenter. I believe the name was Maggie. I
9	didn't get the last name. Are you there, Maggie?
10	MS. ROBBINS: Yeah, hi, this is Maggie Robbins from Worksafe. And I did
11	also want to talk about the advisory committee meeting. I thought it also, as the other
12	commenters had said, went well and there was good substantive discussion.
13	And I do look forward to, as soon as you have some idea when
14	(indiscernible) proposals to be sure and let everybody know for consideration by the
15	Board. I think we're all I think everybody, including the Board, is eager to know what
16	the timeline will be. So, I will encourage you to do that.
17	And one just final note is that there was a period there when, for
18	mysterious reasons, I wasn't actually able to access that meeting via the Zoom link, but
19	had to phone in. And I must say it's completely confusing when you can't see the screen
20	to see what's being talked about, to keep track of exactly where the dialogue is in terms
21	of the text that you're discussing, you know, during the conversation. So, just a
22	comment about that. I encourage anybody who's trying to take part to make sure you
23	can do it with a computer and not just on the phone.
24	Thank you very much. Keep up the good work.
25	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you, Maggie.

1	Do we have any other commenters on the line, John?
2	MR. GOTCHER: There are no further commenters in our queue.
3	CHAIR THOMAS: Is there anybody who is part of the meeting now on

6	testimony and the public meeting is adjourned and the record is closed.
7	We will now proceed with the business meeting. The purpose of the
8	business meeting is to allow the Board to vote on matters before it and to receive
9	briefings from staff regarding the issues listed on the business meeting agenda.
10	Proposed petition decisions for adoption. Louie Costa, Director of
11	California State Legislative Board, SMART Transportation Division; Ryan K. Snow,
12	Chairman, California State Legislative Board, Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers and
13	Trainmen; Petition File No. 581.
14	Petitioners request to amend title and to ensure that the safety and
15	health of all rail and transit carrier workers in California against the spread of COVID-19
16	virus.
17	Ms. Shupe, will you please brief the Board?
18	MS. SHUPE: Thank you, Chair Thomas.
19	The Petitioners request the Board promulgate an emergency regulation
20	that incorporates various Centers for Disease Control and Prevention cleaning and
21	disinfecting guidelines for exposure to COVID-19 in order to protect the workforce of rail
22	and transit carriers under the jurisdiction of the Federal Railroad Administration, Federal
23	Transit Administration, Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration, California Public
24	Utilities Commission and California State Transportation Agency.
25	The proposed decision before you today for Petition 581 includes

1 consideration of both the Division and Board staff evaluations. Both the Division and 2 Board staff evaluations conclude that the Board's adoption of the COVID-19 emergency 3 temporary standard have rendered the Petitioners' request null. The Petitioners are 4 encouraged to engage in the ETS process, which I understand they have elected to do 5 so. 6 For those reasons, the proposed decision before you today recommends 7 a denial. Are there any questions? 8 CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you, Ms. Shupe. 9 Do I have a motion to adopt the petition decision? 10 BOARD MEMBER STOCK: So moved. 11 BOARD MEMBER HARRISON: Second. 12 CHAIR THOMAS: I have a motion and second. Is there anything on the 13 question? Seeing none, Ms. Money, will you please call the roll? 14 MS. MONEY: I'm sorry, I didn't catch who was first and who was second. 15 Sorry about that. 16 BOARD MEMBER STOCK: I think I was first, this is Laura. And Dave was 17 second, Dave Harrison. 18 MS. MONEY: Okay, thank you. 19 Ms. Burgel? 20 BOARD MEMBER BURGEL: Aye. 21 MS. MONEY: Mr. Harrison? 22 BOARD MEMBER HARRISON: Aye. 23 MS. MONEY: Ms. Kennedy? 24 BOARD MEMBER KENNEDY: Aye. 25 MS. MONEY: Ms. Laszcz-Davis?

7	CHAIR THOMAS: Aye.
8	And the motion passes which is to deny the Petition. Thank you.
9	Proposed variance decisions for adoption are listed on the consent
10	calendar. Ms. Gonzalez, will you please brief the Board?
11	MS. GONZALEZ: Good morning Chair Thomas and Board Members. On
12	the consent calendar for your consideration are proposed decisions A through X. These
13	items are ready for your consideration and your possible adoption.
14	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you, Ms. Gonzalez.
15	Do I have any questions for Ms. Gonzalez?
16	BOARD MEMBER HARRISON: Motion to approve.
17	CHAIR THOMAS: I'm sorry, Dave, say that again?
18	BOARD MEMBER HARRISON: Oh, I'm sorry. Motion to approve.
19	CHAIR THOMAS: All right, do I have a second?
20	BOARD MEMBER LASZCZ-DAVIS: Second.
21	CHAIR THOMAS: And that was Chris. So, it was Dave Harrison and then
22	Chris.

3	CHAIR THOMAS: Aye.
4	The motion passes.
5	Division update. Mr. Berg, will you please brief the Board?
6	MR. BERG: Yeah, thank you Chairman Thomas and Board Members.
17	As you've heard, we held an advisory meeting, Cal/OSHA had an advisory
8	meeting about the emergency temporary standard for COVID-19 Prevention last
9	Thursday and Friday and this past Tuesday. And I want to thank everybody, for all the
20	advisory committee members for their valuable input. It's very helpful in us preparing a
21	future changes to the Board to update the standard. And we'll do that as quickly as
22	possible.
23	And we're also asking for persons to submit written comments to us by
24	March 2nd. Once all those comments are in, we'll get started on revising the draft and
25	getting it to the Board as soon as possible.

1	In other rulemaking, we've completed our work on the lead in
2	construction and general industry. We're just waiting to hear back on that one.
3	And on indoor heat, we are still waiting on a third-party contractor from
4	the Department of Industrial Relations to complete the standardized impact regulatory
5	assessment.
6	So, that is all the updates I have for now, thank you.
7	BOARD MEMBER STOCK: Eric, this is Laura. Can I just ask if you have any
8	update on the workplace violence in general industry?
9	MR. BERG: No, we're not (indiscernible). No updates to that one right
0	now.
1	BOARD MEMBER STOCK: Is that one still in the pipeline or is it on the
2	agenda?
13	MR. BERG: Yeah, we still have we will be working on it. We're not
4	working on it actively now because we're occupied with COVID.
5	BOARD MEMBER STOCK: Right. Understandably. All right.
6	CHAIR THOMAS: Anymore questions of Mr. Berg from the Board?
7	All right, seeing none, Ms. Gonzalez oh, legislative update. Ms.
8	Gonzalez, will you please brief the Board?
9	MS. GONZALEZ: Sure, sure. Thank you, Chair Thomas.
20	So, your Board packet contains a number of new bills that we're
21	monitoring right now. We're very early in the legislative session so there's not a whole
22	lot to tell you about those.
23	But I did want to mention AB 701, which was just introduced about two
24	days ago. That's from Lorena
25	Gonzalez and it may require some Board rulemaking, so we're going to monitor that bill

1	It's related to warehouse worker production quotas. And that's all I have.
2	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you. Any questions for Autumn?
3	No questions, Executive Officer's
4	BOARD MEMBER STOCK: I'm sorry, excuse me one second. Autumn,
5	could you say what the bill number is again of that one that you said about warehouse?
6	MS. GONZALEZ: Of course. It's AB 701, Lorena Gonzalez.
7	BOARD MEMBER STOCK: Thank you.
8	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you. If there's no further questions, Executive
9	Officer's report. Ms. Shupe, will you please brief the Board?
10	MS. SHUPE: Thank you, Chair Thomas. Board staff attended the COVID-
11	19 ETS advisory committee meeting held on February 11th, 12th and 16th. We were
12	likewise impressed by the level of interaction among participants, especially given the
13	constraints of the virtual platform.
14	And I would like to extend my congratulations to Chief Parker, Eric Berg
15	and the rest of the Division staff on a very well executed meeting. We look forward to
16	the continuing discussion.
17	Looking forward to March, the Board will consider a proposed decision
18	for Petition 584, which seeks to amend title 8, section 5189.1, Process Safety
19	Management for Petroleum Refineries.
20	Specifically, the applicant requests revisions to the definitions of major
21	change, employee representative, highly hazardous material and effective participation
22	where used in the context of 5189.1.
23	The Petitioner also seeks amendment of the high hazard control analysis
24	hierarchy.
25	At this time, we have not received an evaluation from the Division for

1	Petition 584. The Board is bound by statute to deliver a decision on this matter in
2	March. As such, the proposed decision for this Petition, which is due to be provided for
3	the Board's consideration and public review in just slightly over two weeks, will, by
4	necessity, be drafted absent their input.
5	Should the Division submit an evaluation prior to the Board's meeting,
6	we will post it with the Petition documents and the Board may consider it along with the
7	proposed decision at their meeting in March.
8	Are there any questions from the Board Members?
9	BOARD MEMBER STOCK: Yes, Christina, this is Laura. Did you say who
10	the Petitioner was? Who is that from?
11	MS. SHUPE: It's the Western States Petroleum Association.
12	BOARD MEMBER STOCK: Got it, thank you.
13	CHAIR THOMAS: Any other questions?
14	All right, future agenda items. Do any of the Board Members have any
15	questions regarding future agenda items or proposed that you would like to ask either
16	Christina or Eric or any staff about at this time?
17	BOARD MEMBER LASZCZ-DAVIS: This is Chris, just a real quick question.
18	The timing of the COVID regulation. We've gone through several days of robust
19	advisory committee process exchanges. What is the timing on assimilating that
20	information and coming out with a permanent regulation for consideration?
21	MR. BERG: Excuse me, you said that's for permanent?
22	CHAIR THOMAS: Is that Eric? Go ahead, Eric.
23	MR. BERG: Yeah, you said a permanent regulation? We're not working
24	on a permanent regulation right now.
25	BOARD MEMBER LASZCZ-DAVIS: No, no, but the next draft, if you will.

1	MR. BERG: Oh, okay. Yeah, we're taking comments until March 2nd
2	and hope to finish up a draft by the end of March. That's our aspiration at least. And
3	then, that will have to be reviewed and then we'll get it to the Board as soon as
4	possible.
5	BOARD MEMBER LASZCZ-DAVIS: Thank you.
6	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you, Eric. Thank you, Chris.
7	BOARD MEMBER STOCK: And I
8	CHAIR THOMAS: Any other questions? Go ahead, Laura.
9	BOARD MEMBER STOCK: Yeah, hi. I wonder if we could put on the next
10	agenda a report from the Division about enforcement activities related to COVID. It
11	would be interesting to hear, you know, the impact of the new standard. And I know,
12	I've certainly seen a lot in the news about enforcement actions. But if we could hear a
13	little bit about, you know, what's happened since the regulation has been passed and
14	any challenges, or successes, or comments they would say on how it's going
15	implementing the regulation.
16	MR. BERG: Okay, can you provide something in like an email or in writing
17	so I can because I don't have (indiscernible) to that. But if you provide it to me first, I
18	can send that on to our enforcement unit.
19	MS. SHUPE: I would like to also note for the Board that the Division is
20	posting their enforcement data on their website and that is available right now.
21	BOARD MEMBER STOCK: Okay, yeah that's great. I mean, I guess I'm just
22	thinking it would be interesting, particularly as we're considering the changes to the ETS
23	to just hear a little bit about You know, I see more enforcement actions, but if there
24	was any comment they wanted to make on how the regulation is working, and whether
25	it's being able to achieve the intended goal, or where they might see some issues that

1	have come up in the course of enforcing it, which is just a little bit beyond
2	I mean it's great to be able to look at the enforcement actions.
3	MR. BERG: Yeah, I can pass that on to our enforcement unit,
4	(indiscernible) provide any details and then they can talk to that.
5	BOARD MEMBER STOCK: Appreciate it.
6	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you. Any other questions?
7	All right, at this time
8	MS. SHUPE: The need for a closed session has not arisen today.
9	CHAIR THOMAS: Okay. So, with that, the next Standards Board meeting
10	and hearing is scheduled for March the 18th, 2021, via teleconference and
11	videoconference. Please visit our website and join our mailing list to receive the latest
12	updates.
13	We thank you for your attendance today. There being no further
14	business to attend to, the business meeting is adjourned and we will see you next
15	month. Thank you very much.
