#### PROCEEDINGS

3 DAVID THOMAS: This meeting of the occupational safety 4 and health standards board is now called to order. Let's rise 5 for the pledge, please.

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6 (The Pledge of Allegiance is recited.) 7 DAVID THOMAS: Thank you. I'm Dave Thomas, Chairman. 8 The other Board members present today are Ms. Barbara Burgel, 9 Occupational Health Representative; Ms. Nola Kennedy, Public 10 Member; Ms. Chris Laszcz-Davis, Management Representative, and 11 Ms. Laura Stock, Occupational Safety Representative. Also 12 present from our staff for today's meeting are Ms. Christina Shupe, Executive Officer; Mr. Michael Manieri, Principal Safety 13 Engineer; Mr. Peter Healy, Legal Counsel; Ms. Lara Paskins, 14 Staff Services Manager; Mr. David Kernazitskas, Senior Safety 15 Engineer; and Ms. Sarah Money, Executive Assistant. Present 16 today from the Division of Occupational Safety and Health is Mr. 17 Eric Berg, Deputy Chief of Health. 18

19 If you have not already done so, we invite you to sign 20 the attendance roster which is located on the table at the 21 entrance to the room. It will become part of the official 22 record of today's proceedings. When you sign the attendance 23 roster, please be sure to write legibly so that we have your 24 correct name and contact information for the record. Copies of 25 today's agenda and other materials related to today's

proceedings are also available on the table next to the
 attendance roster.

As reflected on the agenda, today's meeting consists of 3 two parts. First, we'll hold the public meeting to receive 4 5 public comments and proposals on occupational safety and health matters. Anyone who would like to address any occupational 6 7 safety and health issues should come up to the microphone during the public meeting when I invite public comment. After the 8 9 public meeting, we will conduct the second part of our meeting, 10 which is a business meeting to act on those items listed on the business meeting agenda. The Board does not accept public 11 comment during its business meeting unless a Board member 12 specifically requests public input. 13

We will now proceed with the public meeting. Anyone who 14 wishes to address the Board regarding matters pertaining to 15 occupational safety and health is invited to comment except, 16 however, the Board does not entertain comments regarding 17 variance decisions. The Board's variance hearings are 18 19 administrative hearings where procedural due process rights are carefully preserved. Therefore, we will not grant requests to 20 21 address the Board on variance matters. At this time, is there 22 anyone who would like to comment on any matters concerning 23 occupational safety and health? If you would like to, please 24 come up to the microphone and state your name and affiliation 25 for the record.

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Good morning.

2 AUGUSTINE EICHWALD-ROMERO: Good morning, Chairman; members of the Board; DAR staff; CAL-OSHA staff and Board staff. 3 My name is Augustine Eichwald-Romero. I'm the staff attorney at 4 Worksafe. On behalf of Worksafe, I would like to extend our 5 appreciation to the Division for providing us with the 6 opportunity to provide comments during the previous meetings. 7 8 This is regarding the proposed safety order for adoption which 9 is the Employee Access to Injury and Illness Prevention 10 Programs. We thank you for the comments at the previous 11 meetings, for taking our comments at previous meetings, and we 12 are grateful to Division staff for their responses to our comments and for their thorough and expeditious effort in 13 drafting this standard. 14

We believe that workers' rights access to IIP's is vital 15 to the successful implementation of any IIP. Access to 16 employers' IIP is vital to ensuring workers know how to 17 communicate hazards to their employers and understand, or be 18 19 aware of, the various controls an employer would use and lay out 20 their IIPP. We want to let everyone know that it is important because it allows all workers to have a meaningful role in 21 22 creating a safe workplace. So we strongly urge adoption of 23 Employee Access to IIPP as a standard. Please note that in addition to Worksafe, the California Rural Assistance Foundation 24

and the California Nurses Association are also in support of
 these comments. Thank you.

3 CHAIRMAN: Thank you.

DAN LEACOX: Good morning Board and staff. Dan Leacox, 4 5 petitioner for this rulemaking being voted on today. So, I 6 would agree with the Worksafe comments. We are saying the same 7 Special thanks to Mr. Kernazitskas who was the most thing. 8 hands-on about it, but also thank you to the staff. This is one 9 of those rulemakings where a lot of things, in my opinion, it 10 could have gone in a lot of very problematic directions, but the 11 staff managed to thread that needle nice and guickly. After reading the responses and comments feel like it was well thought 12 out and well-intended as to the result, so I also would urge 13 14 that you pass the rule. Thank you.

DAVID THOMAS: Any other comments? Hearing none, thank
you for your testimony. The Board appreciates the public
testimony. This meeting is adjourned, and the record is closed.

We will now proceed with the business meeting. The purpose of the business meeting is to allow the Board to vote on matters before it and to receive briefings from staff regarding issues listed on the business meeting agenda. The Board does not accept public comment during its business meeting unless a member of the Board specifically requests public input.

24 Proposed safety orders for adoption. Title 8, General
25 Industry Safety Orders, Section 3203. Public Employee Access to

Injury and Illness -- Employee Access to Injury and Illness
 Prevent Program. Mr. Manieri, will you please brief the Board?

MR. MANIERI: Yes. Chairman Thomas and members of the 3 Board, the Board and the public will recall the adoption of the 4 5 proposed petition decision regarding petition file 562 on June 15th, 2017. The petition, submitted by Mr. Dan Leacox, 6 pertains to timely employee access to the employer's IIPP. 7 The 8 petition decision directed Board staff convene an advisory 9 committee for the purpose of considering the development of a 10 rulemaking proposal to address the issue described in the 11 petition.

Factually, Section 3203, the Injury and Illness 12 Prevention Program standard does not explicitly state that 13 employees are entitled to receive, review, or copy their 14 employer's IIPP. The current proposal is intended to ensure 15 employee access to the IIPP by specifying who can request such 16 access, what information is to be provided, and the timeframe 17 for the request to be fulfilled. The amendments are necessary 18 19 to clarify to the employer that the employees have a right of 20 access to the IIPP, and what that access actually entails. The 21 proposal contains several definitions. Among them, one that defines the term access and what is a designated representative. 22 23 There is specific language which explains the employer's duty to provide timely access and communication between the employer and 24 25 the affected employees regarding their access rights.

1 The proposed rulemaking differs from the federal regulations in that there are no comparable federal IIPP 2 regulations to begin with. Consequently, federal OSHA 3 determined, as you know, the proposal is commensurate with their 4 standards. Board staff believes that the anticipated benefits 5 6 of the proposal, which was developed with the assistance of an 7 advisory committee, will ensure that, number one, all employees 8 have sufficient access to the employer's IIPP. Number two, the 9 employee's understanding of how to communicate those hazards to 10 their employer under the IIPP is improved, and number three, 11 will aid in the understanding of the injury and illness 12 prevention program, and the role of the employee/employer 13 relationship and partnership in creating and maintaining a safe and healthful workplace, which is the underlying intent and 14 spirit of the IIPP law which became effective many years ago. 15 The proposed access standards will clarify the employer's 16 responsibility and the process under Title 8 IIPP requirements 17 to communicate important workplace safety program information to 18 19 their employees consistent with petition 562 and the spirit 20 again of Section 3203. At this time, the Board staff recommends 21 that the proposal be adopted by the Board. Thank you.

DAVID THOMAS: Thank you Mr. Manieri. Do I have amotion to adopt the revisions as proposed?

SARAH MONEY: Ms. Laszcz-Davis? 8 9 CHRIS LASZCZ-DAVIS: Aye. SARAH MONEY: Ms. Stock? 10 11 LAURA STOCK: Ave. SARAH MONEY: Chairman Thomas? 12 CHAIRMAN THOMAS: Aye. And the motion passes. 13 Proposed petition decisions for adoption. Richard 14 Manuel, Safety Director of Lancaster Burns Construction, Inc. 15 Petition file number 578. Petitioner requests amendment to the 16 Construction Safety Orders, Section 1710(1) to clarify to 17 employers when the use of barrier planking is required as a 18 19 means for preventing workers from falling through floor openings 20 during multi story high rise steel erection through the use of 21 an exception to subsection (1). Ms. Shupe, will you please brief the Board? 22

CHRISTINA SHUPE: Thank you, Chair Thomas. The petition
has been thoroughly evaluated by the both Division and the Board
staff. The Division recommends denying the petition, including

the petitioner's proposal contradicts both California labor code
 and federal OSHA regulations, and petitioner's proposal to add
 clarity would instead unnecessarily be duplicative of existing
 requirements.

Board staff, after a thorough examination of relevant 5 6 federal, state, and national consensus standards, also recommends the petition be denied. Board staff participated 7 8 with the Division in an on-site visit to further explore 9 petitioner's proposal and takes the position that petitioner's 10 description of his experience may imply that at least some of 11 the regulated public is unaware of the major reasons for providing temporary flooring within 30 feet, or two stories 12 below, steel erection work and concludes that an employer 13 seeking a potentially safer way of performing the task may run 14 into conflict with the unstated reasons for requirements of the 15 temporary flooring. However, both Board and Division staff are 16 in concurrence that the provisions of Labor Code Section 7253, 17 which specifically requires planking or nets, and Labor Code 18 19 142.3, which requires the Board adopt regulations at least as effective as federal regulations, limit the Board's authority to 20 21 provide the regulatory exceptions proposed by the petition. For 22 these reasons, the proposed decision before you today proposes 23 denying the petition. The petition is now ready for your 24 decision.

19	Proposed variance decisions for adoption. The proposed
20	variance decisions for adoption are listed on the consent
21	calendar. Mr. Healy, will you please brief the Board?
22	PETER HEALY: Yes. Thank you, Chair Thomas and members.
23	On your consent calendar today are proposed variance decisions,
24	items A through L. Regarding proposed decisions items A through
25	L, I am aware of no unresolved procedural matters and believe
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items A through L are ready for your consideration on the
 question of adoption.

3 DAVID THOMAS: Thank you, Mr. Healy. Are there any4 questions for Mr. Healy?

5 BARBARA BURGEL: I have a question. We got this in our6 packet. Is this an additional vote?

7 PETER HEALY: It contained a clerical correction. The 8 substance, it did not change the substance of the decision. 9 We're always scrupulous about the formalities. It's that even 10 with the clerical correction, that was formally served, and you 11 were provided that as the actual one that you will be voting on.

BARBARA BURGEL: Okay. Okay. So this is actually inaddition to the Otis?

PETER HEALY: It's, in substance, the one covering the same case numbers, and it comes with a page two clerical correction. The substance of the decision otherwise is identical.

DAVID THOMAS: Thank you. Executive Officer's Report.
 Ms. Shupe, will you please brief the Board?

CHRISTINA SHUPE: Thank you, Chair Thomas. Last year, 3 the Department of Industrial Relations began a long-term 4 5 accessibility update to their website, and the documents housed 6 on it, with the goal of bringing us into compliance with 7 Government Codes 7405 and 11135. As part of this , a number of older rulemaking documents are being archived and will no longer 8 9 be posted on the OSHSB website. We're carefully evaluating 10 documents prior to archiving them, and none of the Board's proposed, recently adopted, or otherwise active documents will 11 be affected. Documents that are archived are still available to 12 the public through the Board's public records officer, and a 13 statement to that effect has been added to our webpages. 14

I'm also excited the share with the Board a new addition 15 Jacquelyn Lowe has joined us as a retired 16 to our staff. annuitant. She brings more than 35 years of administrative 17 legal support and analytical experience to our team. Most 18 19 recently, Jackie has spent 18 years with the Department of 20 Consumer Affairs assigned to the Board for professional 21 engineers, land surveyors and geologists. She'll be assisting 22 us on various projects over the next year as we update internal 23 procedures and streamline processes, an area in which she 24 excels.

Looking forward to next month, the Board will hold 1 public hearings on a regulatory proposal for Commercial Diving 2 Operations, and a Horcher rulemaking for Cranes and Derricks in 3 Construction: Operator Qualifications -- I apologize. 4 That's a The Board will be holding public hearings on 5 misstatement. 6 Commercial Diving Operations and a proposed Horcher for technical corrections to section 5189. The Board will also 7 consider for adoption a proposal for Outdoor Agricultural 8 9 Operations During Hours of Darkness, and for adoption a proposal 10 for the Horcher rulemaking for Cranes and Derricks in 11 Construction: Operator Qualification.

12 DAVID THOMAS: Thank you Ms. Shupe. Future agenda 13 items. Do the Board members have any questions regarding future 14 agenda times for this year?
