1	As reflected on the agenda, today's meeting consists of two
2	parts. First, we will hold the public meeting to receive public comments
3	on proposals on occupational safety and health matters. Anyone who
4	would like to address any occupational safety and health issues,
5	including any of the items on our business meeting agenda, you may do
6	so at that time. Members of the public who have contacted staff, either
7	by email or phone, and asked to be placed in the public comment queue
8	will be called on in turn. Additionally, those joining via Webex may ask

3	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you, Ms. Haikalis.
4	INTERPRETER HAIKALIS: Thank you.
5	CHAIR THOMAS: At this time, Mr. Gotcher, do we have any
6	commenters in the queue?
7	MR. GOTCHER: Our first commenter is Bruce Wick from the
8	Housing Contractors of California.
9	CHAIR THOMAS: Good morning, Bruce. Can you hear us?
10	MR. WICK: Good morning. Yes Sir, I can.
11	CHAIR THOMAS: Go ahead.
12	MR. WICK: I thought there were others signed up.
13	I do want to congratulate Dave Harrison and Laura Stock for
14	reappointment and welcome Kate Crawford. Look forward it's really
15	nice to have a full Board, so looking forward. 2021 is starting off well.
16	Thank you.
17	I do want to just talk about the COVID reg, the advisory
18	committee, and the importance, I think, you know, of this Board really
19	pursuing a collaborative effort with the Division. You know the Division's
20	resources are, I think limited as, you know, your staff is as well, we
21	understand. But there's so much that can be done, especially if we're
22	trying to promote an emergency reg. You know, we've looked at the
23	Q&A. I mean, we're already up to 69 questions and some of them were
24	(Audio cuts out)
25	CHAIR THOMAS: We lost you, Bruce. Are you there?

1	MR. WICK: you know, some or yes. Can you near mer
2	CHAIR THOMAS: I can hear you now. Yeah, we lost you for a
3	second, so you might want to go back and repeat.
4	MR. WICK: Okay. Thank you. Sorry.
5	So we just hope in the upcoming advisory committee that
6	there's that the Division staff will work in concert with your staff
7	because that's how we get true collaboration. That's how we get proper
8	vetting and that's how we come up with regs that really do are able to
9	be implemented and implemented well. We can have a reg that has a lot
10	of protection on paper, but on the employer side especially, we have to
11	translate that to supervisors who understand it and can demonstrate it
12	and teach it to their employees. And so it's important how clean and
13	clear and implementable, if that's a word, a regulation is when we
14	promulgate it, when we promote it.
15	So appreciate that and look forward to, you know, working
16	together on this as we go forward with the advisory committee.
17	Thank you.
18	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you, Mr. Wick. Appreciate your
19	comments.
20	Mr. Gotcher, who do we have in the queue?
21	MR. GOTCHER: Our next commenter is Maggie Robbins from
22	Worksafe.
23	CHAIR THOMAS: Hi, Maggie.
24	MS. ROBBINS: Hi Board. Can you hear me all right?
25	CHAIR THOMAS: We can. Go right ahead.

1	MS. ROBBINS: All right, thank you.
2	I just want to make a few brief comments. First, yes, indeed
3	welcoming and re-welcoming the Board Members who were sworn in
4	today.
5	I just wanted to thank you again for completing the COVID
6	Prevention Standard. We're getting so many questions about it, as we do
7	with any new standard, and a lot of enthusiasm, and a lot of, you know,
8	high expectations. So, at any rate, I just wanted to pass that on. There
9	is keen interest in this reg, you know, very broad across a lot of the
10	people who reach out to us and a lot of the organizations that we partner
11	with.
12	We, too, are looking forward to the advisory committee
13	meeting process and continuing to have updating a dialog to update
14	the standard, as is as is needed. And we're paying keen attention to
15	the legal challenges to the standard and I want to assure you that we're
16	participating in that and will be providing, or have provided, supporting
17	amicus briefs to those lawsuits and we await to see how they turn out.
18	At any rate I, again, just wanted to really thank you and to
19	say you've done a lot of work and we really appreciate it and we're
20	looking forward to having it fully implemented.
21	Thank you.
22	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you.
23	Mr. Gotcher, who do we have next in the queue?
24	MR. GOTCHER: Our next commenter is Rob Moutrie from Cal
25	Chamber.

1	CHAIR THOMAS: Mr. Moutrie
2	MR. MOUTRIE: Good morning, I'm trying a new microphone
3	that's less obtrusive. Can everyone hear me okay?
4	CHAIR THOMAS: We can. Go right ahead.
5	MR. MOUTRIE: Thank you. Sorry to be the person who
6	always asks that question.
7	CHAIR THOMAS: Everybody does. It's all right.
8	MR. MOUTRIE: Yeah. It's one of the things for this last year
9	or so.
10	So briefly, I'd like to start off, as Ms. Robbins and Mr. Wick
11	did, congratulating Kate and congratulating Laura and Dave on their
12	reappointment. It is nice to have a full Board and nice to have some
13	stable government going on in the context of things.
14	So with that, I'd like to briefly flag some of the ongoing
15	concerns of the COVID ETS, which we're hoping will be addressed coming
16	up, but in light of the recent released FAQs, I thought
17	I'd the Board deserves kind of an update on
18	how what those FAQs had or hadn't addressed, so you are apprised of
19	where our concerns were there.
20	So I would like also like to echo Ms. Robbins comment
21	regarding interests. You know, not a day goes by that I don't have emails
22	or calls from employers saying, what exactly does this mean? How do we
23	quite do this? And the FAQs have helped at some points and I would like
24	to thank Division staff for their hard work there. Obviously, they haven't
25	slept in six to eight months. I know Eric certainly probably has not, and

1 Doug as well, so thank you for that work.
---

- Briefly flagging some ongoing -- some points. I'd like to also express appreciation for Division staff for the careful balance struck in its delayed fines, where citations will be issued but the fines will not be issued for a brief bit. Just until early next month, so very brief, but giving businesses a little time to figure this out while still including that that stick of citation.
  - As to ongoing concerns. We still get questions and the FAQs, I think, don't address this, regarding employer's ability -- around the leave, the sick leave provided and whether it's meant to be creating a new sick leave category or whether it's meant to -- and is it meant to be unlimited or is it meant to include existing sick leave? We have legal concerns that the employer cannot, as a legal matter, compel the use of paid sick leave, which the present FAQs imagine to be feasible. So that's an issue which we will be talking about at the advisory committee and you may be hearing about in March.

Also, we have ongoing concerns with availability of tests, and I think this is an across the aisle issue. You know, enough tests out there makes this work and makes everyone safer. So we're hopeful the State will do more there.

We also have ongoing concerns about the use of nonemployees starting an outbreak. You know, the old grocery store example. A family of three comes through and tests positive. Later, under this regulation, the grocery store is in an outbreak, though no employees have caught it. So those are some specific examples which

1	we'll be talking about at the upcoming advisory, and which you may
2	hear about in March.
3	And the last big issue, which I hope the Board will weigh in is
4	vaccinated employees. You know, as the vaccine is spreading out,
5	thankfully, and actually I hope some of you will be getting this soon. I
6	know I will not be getting this until the last round probably, but as it
7	spreads out, we're hopeful to see the regulation reflecting that. And
8	hopeful to see that, kind of, so that we can get to a place where it
9	reflects both unvaccinated and vaccinated employees as soon as possible.
10	So turning to that, the last point I'll make is to Bruce's point
11	about the advisory committee meeting. Really glad to see it coming.
12	Really glad to talk about the changes there with Division staff. Two
13	comments, and this goes back to comments we've had with the Board for
14	the last year or so, we're really hopeful to see that interactive, kind of
15	Standards Board model process where we can talk through items and
16	with everybody at the table. You know, labor, management, you know,
17	public, private, everybody there to work through the issues and come to
18	a more workable document as soon as we can. And hopefully that'll
19	happen before the March meeting and we can give you the update then.
20	I don't want to take more of your time. So thank you all.
21	Hope you're staying safe and healthy.
22	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you, Rob. Appreciate your
23	comments.
24	John, who do we have next in the queue?
25	MR. GOTCHER: There are no further commenters in our

1	queue.

24	Just very briefly, I wanted to just make a comment about
25	with the advisory committee meeting and reviewing the language of the

1	regulation, just an encouragement for ensuring that language that's
2	currently in FAQs to clarify and provide really necessary and helpful
3	clarification. Thank you so much for those FAQs, they've been very, very
4	helpful. But without that language being in the final regulation, there's
5	lots of people in the regulated community who are concerned that they
6	will still be cited, even as they're following what the FAQs tell them to
7	do, but there's too much room for interpretation in the actual text of the
8	regulation itself.
9	So just an encouragement to try to include as much clarity in
10	the final text as possible so that we don't have unnecessary citations of
11	employers who are trying to do their best to comply based on the FAQs.
12	And that is it. Thank you.
13	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you. Thank you, Ms. Hilaski.
14	John, do we have anybody else in the queue?
15	MR. GOTCHER: I'd like to circle back to Kevin Bland and see
16	if he has figured out his mute issue.
17	CHAIR THOMAS: I don't know if we should or not. Are you
18	there, Kevin?
19	MR. GOTCHER: So I can see that you're unmuted on Webex.
20	If you're using external microphone, you might need to unmute that as
21	well.
22	CHAIR THOMAS: Yeah, I think that's it.
23	MR. GOTCHER: Or you could need to change your

- 7 MR. BLAND: I actually -- I actually tested it before I got on,
- 8 where you can do the test, make sure the microphone and speaker and
- 9 everything is coming and it speaks back to you. But oh well.
- 10 Good morning, Chairman and Board Members and welcome
- 11 to the Board, Kate. And welcome, I guess back to the Board, or
- 12 continued on the Board, Dave and Laura. It's good to have a full Board,
- 13 as everyone else has said this morning.
- 14 I just have a couple things, and this is more like if we have to
- 15 go through anything like this with an emergency reg in the future. The --
- 16 I know there's a lot of time and energy and (indiscernible) in to putting
- 17 the language together in this regulation by those. But what we ended up
- 18 with, without having the vetting process in the beginning, has really
- 19 made it very difficult to advise clients on compliance with it. I
- 20 understand we have, you know, 69 FAQs. Some of the FAQs go beyond
- what the language says. Some may fall short of what the language says.
- 22 And so we're trying to ferret through that, and I know we hear a lot of
- 23 stories from folks about noncompliance. I can probably match those
- 24 times ten on stories of trying to comply, and compliance at great lengths
- 25 by employers.

1	And just like an example of something of that I think about,
2	we have this excluding COVID cases from the worksite and we we're in
3	an outbreak situation and it says no positive test is required to go back
4	to work. Right? But do they get back into the testing pool? Because
5	when you have we're out of the contagion period, you can still test
6	positive, some folks up to three months. And so what is how do you
7	ever get out of your numbers whenever you've had your COVID cases and
8	they go back in? That's not that's not identified in the reg, wasn't I
9	don't think was contemplated. That's an example.
10	The other thing is the notices and the crossovers between
11	685 and 3205 and the notices, I mean, at some point, you're giving the
12	same person as many as six different notices. I may be exaggerating a
13	little bit. But there's basically six notices and they don't all match. And
14	you end up sending and if you're in an outbreak situation, you're
15	sending a new notice that says the same thing every single day. So I
16	don't think that was completely contemplated about how that when
17	rubber meets the road, how the interface with 685 was and the
18	practicality of the notices and the distinctions between different notices.
19	One example of that is if you tried to do a combined notice,
20	3205 notice has testing information and is really going to the employees
21	that are excluded because of an exposure meaning the six, 15, 24 rule,
22	six feet, 24 hours. They're going to get tested, they're going to be
23	excluded for 14 days. Well, on top of that, you also has 685 notice that
24	has to go to those same folks that doesn't have the same information.
25	And if you try to do one combined notice, you're going to be sending the

1 same notice through the worksite to everyone that's going t		1
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- excluded plus everyone that is there and it's going to cause this
- 3 confusion.

things.

- So some of these things I hope we can get ferreted out in the advisory committee. But of course that's going to be no change for six months from now. So those are things that if we could have vetted this early on, it would have been beneficial. I understand the pressures, the pressures of this pandemic. It's new and novel, it's called novel because it's novel. Right? No one exactly knows what to do with it at any given day and any given time. We have a lot of theories and a lot of different
  - So from a compliance standpoint, and the same thing we're going to deal with on enforcement, if they issue citations, we're just going to get totally backlogged on all these nuances of whether we're in compliance, not in compliance. And so unintended consequences of this, we really need to hope if we ever have a situation like this again, we can jump on it, get together, employers, and labor, and the Division, and Board staff, and think through it a little bit more.
  - And I appreciate all the efforts and I understand the positions you guys are in in this situation, but these are just food for thought future. And then kind of leads into the importance of this advisory committee. You know, I've been doing this for almost 20 years and I find that the Board and the Board staff do an excellent job at advisory committees. We have worked together through some very difficult problems before, come out on the other end with, maybe it's not

1	a regulation that everybody likes, but we feel like we can comply with as
2	employers, the Division can enforce effectively without a bunch of
3	litigation over what a word means, and moving forward.
4	So I'm hoping this next advisory committee can at least be
5	co-chaired, maybe with Board staff and Division staff. I understand it's
6	probably the Division's to hold because it's a health standard but I would
7	really urge and hope that especially because it's at the Board's behest
8	that this advisory committee take place, that we can do a good joint
9	advisory committee and be effective with the outcome of that so that we
10	can try to dig ourselves out of this quagmire.
11	So I really appreciate your time this morning. Sorry. I guess
12	I want to apologize, you're probably happy I'm short today because
13	I've got to jump on to a COVID webinar call in about four minutes. So I
14	appreciate it.
15	Congratulations to the Board having a full Board staff. And
16	thank you for all your hard work.
17	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you, Kevin.
18	All right. John, who do we have next up in the queue?
19	MR. GOTCHER: Our next commenter is Eric Frumin from
20	Change to Win.
21	CHAIR THOMAS: Eric, are you there?
22	MR. FRUMIN: I am. Can you hear me okay, Dave?
23	CHAIR THOMAS: Yes, we can hear you. Go right ahead.
24	MR. FRUMIN: Thank you very much. My name is Eric Frumin
25	I'm with the labor union federation Change to Win.

1	I'm calling in by phone because I had some difficulty signing
2	in on the Webex version. Apparently, it's new software, so I apologize
3	for that and look forward to participating by Webex in the future.
4	I have some very brief comments to make. First, again want
5	to express our appreciation to the Board and to DOSH and to OAL for
6	their rapid action in the end of November moving the standard forward
7	and now to all of you and to the Attorney General's office for supporting
8	the standard in the face of the challenges to it by the parties who feel
9	aggrieved.
10	I think the spirit of cooperation that we've seen from many
11	commenters and that we saw at the advisory committee meeting in
12	December was very positive and we certainly hope as we've seen on this
13	call today, different parties including unions and worker advocates who
14	will make a good faith effort to participate in the advisory process that
15	you have laid out in front of us to keep this thing moving in a positive
16	direction and responding to the myriad of problems that are undoubtedly
17	going to arise trying to implement the standard. But when done in good
18	faith in recognition of the crisis, you know, we'll get through it.
19	I think it's unfortunate that some people refuse to accept
20	the notion that this is an emergency and that's even reflected in some of
21	the appeals. It's kind of odd that anyone would take that position but
22	nonetheless, it certainly is an emergency, the Board has done a good job,
23	and I appreciate this leadership's declaration in the court case
24	reaffirming the process for finding an emergency and that's really vital to
25	supporting this regulation. So, many people will take it for granted, I

1	just	want	to	say	we	apprec	iate	the	Board's	efforts	to	keep	the	stand	ard

2 moving forward and provide a beacon of hope for people who are in this

very difficult time trying to figure out a way forward.

only the documents that the attorney general filed on your behalf but also those filed by the unions at the legal services community describing the crisis from the standpoint of workers. These are very powerful descriptions of what workers have had to experience. We've heard a lot of that on the Board's calls. But there's quite a bit more there if anyone has any reservations about considering this an emergency, an ongoing emergency and a need for employers to respond to a mandate, rather than to guidance which does not seem to have had much effect on some portions of the employer community.

other portions of the employer community who have taken this very seriously and we've seen good evidence of that on these calls and the public comment period and we'll continue to see good evidence of that in the advisory committee process. But it certainly is not comprehensive and there's a lot of places, different industries, the food service industry certainly being a large one, where workers continue to be exposed through today to preventable exposure to COVID hazards.

So thank you again for your work. We'll, you know, we'll keep the faith and we'll continue to work with you going forward. I don't want to repeat the comments from Maggie and Chris and other worker advocates about the FAQs. Again, there's a lot to work out and I support

1	their concerns, and we look forward to working with you again.
2	So thank you again for your hard work.
3	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you.
4	John, who do we have who do we have next up in the
5	queue?
6	MR. GOTCHER: There are no commenters in the queue at

18	the Board?
19	MR. BERG: Thank you, Chairman Thomas.
20	CHAIR THOMAS: There you go. Go right ahead, Eric.
21	MR. BERG: Okay. Thank you.
22	At Cal/OSHA, we are working diligently now on the undraft
23	proposed changes to the emergency COVID-19 Prevention regulation
24	based on comments we received prior to and after the December
25	meeting. And once we're finished with those proposed changes to

1	address all the comments, we'll post those so everyone can look at
2	them.
3	And then we'll schedule an advisory committee meeting to
4	go through an interactive process to make changes to the draft proposal
5	as needed. And the advisory committee meeting should be scheduled for
6	mid-February.
7	Thank you. That is all I have.
8	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you, Eric.
9	Legislative update. Ms. Shupe, will you please brief the
10	Board?
11	MS. SHUPE: The Legislature briefly convened on December
12	$7^{\text{th}}$ to swear in newly elected legislators during which time bills were
13	introduced. The Legislature then recessed and reconvened on January
14	11 <sup>th</sup> , 2021.
15	There is a written legislative briefing in your Board packet
16	and also posted as part of the Board packet on our website. As of
17	January 11 <sup>th</sup> when that briefing was prepared, of the 158 bills that had
18	been introduced, staff have identified four with potential impacts to the
19	Board or its work, including AB 7, Emergency Ambulance Employees
20	Subsidized Protective Gear; AB 62, Income Tax Credits Cost to Comply
21	with COVID-19 Regulations; AB 73, Employment Safety Agricultural
22	Workers Wildfire Smoke; SB 46, Employment Contact Tracing and Safety
23	Policies Related to COVID-19.
24	Now the Legislature had only been in sessions for a few days
25	when we prepared this briefing so we'll have a much more substantial

1	briefing for you coming in February.
2	Thank you.
3	CHAIR THOMAS: Thank you, Ms. Shupe.
4	Executive Officer's Report. Ms. Shupe?
5	MS. SHUPE: Did Ms. Stock have a question?
6	CHAIR THOMAS: I don't know, did she?
7	MS. SHUPE: Oh, okay. I'm seeing no.
8	CHAIR THOMAS: No.
9	MS. SHUPE: Okay. Thank you.
0	The first thing I would like to do is officially welcome our
1	new Chief Counsel Autumn Gonzalez to the staff. Ms. Gonzalez joined us
12	on December 21st and will be leading the effort to ensure the Board is
13	properly represented in all legal matters.
4	Since our last meeting, the Board has been named as a
5	defendant in two lawsuits challenging the COVID-19 emergency
6	temporary standards. As noted on the agenda, the Board will meet in
17	closed session for the purposes of being briefed on the pending
8	litigation.
9	And I'd like to say that while we are thrilled that Ms.
20	Gonzalez has joined our team, it's important to note that the Board
21	continues to experience an unprecedented workload. In addition to
22	litigation, in 2020, the Board received record numbers of public
23	petitions; a record number of variance applications, both common and
24	uncommon; and processed a record number of emergency actions via the
25	wildfire smoke protection and COVID-19 ETS in addition to our regular

1	rulemaking duties all while adapting to the realities of the pandemic.
2	I want to thank the Board Members and our stakeholders for
3	your grace and patience during this time and ask that you continue to
4	offer it as we move into 2021. Our challenges are not yet in the rearviev
5	mirror.
6	Looking forward to February. The Board will consider a
7	proposed decision for Petition 581 which seeks to amend title 8 to enact
8	regulatory protection specific to COVID-19 for rail and transit carriers in
9	California.
10	Are there any questions from the Board Members?
11	BOARD MEMBER STOCK: Yes, I have a question. This is
12	Laura.
13	I I had read in the paper that there that the Governor's
14	budget included an increase for the Standards Board which I was glad to
15	see. And I just wanted to comment to see if you had any comments on
16	that and whether that might be able to help increase staffing or provide
17	you with greater resource. Excuse me.
18	MS. SHUPE: So we do have actually some staffing that has
19	been allocated to us but the reality is, is that we need even more,
20	particularly in legal support. And so we will be reviewing the Governor's
21	budget as it proceeds through the spring revise or I'm sorry, the May
22	revise and we will likely be submitting a budget change proposed list as
23	well going forward.
24	CHAIR THOMAS: Any other questions the Board might have?
25	Hearing none. Since we have no other business at this time,

1	we're going t	to go into a	a closed session	n pursuant to	Government C	ode
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- 2 Sections 11126(e)1 and 11126(a)1, the Board shall now enter a closed
- 3 session to confer with counsel regarding pending litigation matters on

- BOARD MEMBER LASZCZ-DAVIS: Yeah, I didn't see it either,
- 15 Laura.
- MS. SHUPE: Ms. Money will be sending you the closed
- 17 session information shortly.
- 18 BOARD MEMBER LASZCZ-DAVIS: All right. Thank you.
- 19 BOARD MEMBER STOCK: And one last question. I just see on
- 20 our agenda before the closed session future agenda items. And I don't
- 21 know if we're going to do that after our closed session or should we
- 22 mention them now?
- 23 CHAIR THOMAS: I thought we covered a couple, but go
- 24 ahead, (indiscernible).
- 25 BOARD MEMBER STOCK: I'm sorry, I may have missed that. I

- 1 just wanted to put on a future agenda hearing from the Division, if they
- 2 can, what their enforcement experience is since the passage of the ETS.
- 3 Just to get a report about the inspections that they've done and the
- 4 outcomes of those inspections.
- 5 So if we can add that to maybe next month's agenda, I'd
- 6 appreciate it.
- 7 CHAIR THOMAS: We can do that.
- 8 BOARD MEMBER STOCK: Thank you.
- 9 CHAIR THOMAS: Any other items?
- 10 MS. SHUPE: I see Barbara.
- 11 CHAIR THOMAS: Barbara.
- BOARD MEMBER BURGEL: Yeah, this is Barbara.
- 13 I would like to hear -- and I know this is probably, you know,
- but what is the status of the Indoor Heat Standard? I just wanted to find
- out what's happening with that, if anything.
- MR. BERG: Yeah, this is Eric. Yeah, the SRIA we've been
- working on the Standard Regulatory Impact Assessment has a third-party
- 18 contractor from -- sorry, third-party contractor that DIR has contracted
