**NOTICE OF MODIFICATIONS TO TEXT OF
PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO REGULATIONS GOVERNING LABOR
COMPLIANCE PROGRAMS and COMPLIANCE MONITORING AND
ENFORCEMENT BY DEPARTMENT OF INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS**

CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS

TITLE 8, CHAPTER 8, SUBCHAPTER 4 AND 4.5

Pursuant to the requirements of Government Code section 11346.8(c) and section 44 of Title 1 of the California Code of Regulations, the Acting Director of the Department of Industrial Relations is providing notice of changes made to the proposed amendments to the regulations governing Labor Compliance Programs and the regulations governing Compliance Monitoring and Enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations. These proposals were the subject of a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking published in the California Regulatory Notice Register (Register 2011, No. 26-Z) on July 1, 2011, a written comment period commencing on July 1, 2011 and closing on August 15, 2011, and a public hearing conducted in San Francisco on August 15, 2011. These proposals were also affected by legislation (AB 436 (Solorio)) that has just been passed by the Legislature and is awaiting action by the Governor.

Largely in response to the legislation, changes have been made to sections 16423, 16451, 16452, 16454, and 16455, while section 16453 is now proposed for repeal without any replacement language. Non-substantial changes that are directly related to the original proposed regulatory action have also been made to section 16433 of the Labor Compliance Program regulations.

In addition to this Notice and the text of the revised proposals, the Acting Director is also issuing a Supplement Statement of Reasons to further explain the latest revisions. This Supplemental Statement of Reasons is being provided to interested parties along with this Notice and the regulatory text and is also being posted on the Department's web site (at http://www.dir.ca.gov/dlse/cmu/Rulemaking/Rulemaking_SBX2-9-2011.htm) and incorporated into the rulemaking record.
